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## Speaker Biographies

### Keynote



**Barbara Arnwine** is the president & founder of the Transformative Justice Coalition, is internationally renowned for contributions on critical justice issues including the passage of the landmark Civil Rights Act of 1991 and the 2006 reauthorization of provisions of the Voting Rights Act. A graduate of Scripps College and Duke University School of Law, she continues to champion civil rights and racial justice issues nationally and internationally in the areas of housing and lending, community development, employment, voting, education, and environmental justice.

Ms. Arnwine's work also includes women's rights, immigrant rights, judicial diversity, criminal justice reform, racial profiling, health care disparities and LGBTQ rights. A prominent leader in the civil and human rights community, she continues to fight for the preservation of affirmative action and diversity programs.

In addition to Ms. Arnwine's instrumental work leading to the passage of the 1991 Civil Rights Act, she has served in numerous other capacities, including international civil, human and women's rights matters. Under her leadership, the Lawyers' Committee continues to participate in monitoring treaty compliance and responding to reports written by the United States regarding the requirements of both the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination following the United Nations (UN) Human Rights Council's Universal Periodic Review.

Ms. Arnwine is a prominent leader of Election Protection (EP), the nation's largest nonpartisan voter protection coalition, launched in 2004 to assist historically disenfranchised persons to exercise the fundamental right to vote. Today, the coalition consists of more than 100 organizations and thousands of attorney volunteers. The EP and Lawyers' Committee websites and social media received millions of visits in 2012. EP hosted 38 call centers across the country on Election Day with more than 5,300 trained legal volunteers and 2,300 grassroots volunteers in 22 states and more than 80 voting jurisdictions.

In early 2011, Ms. Arnwine and the Lawyers' Committee began tracking suppressive voting legislation nationwide, and created the now well known "Map of Shame," which served as a wake-up call to the American people about states' proposals or disenfranchising legislation that primarily threatened the right to vote of minorities; students; low-income, disabled and elderly

persons. Ms. Arnwine was at the vanguard of speaking out about this injustice and educating the public about these efforts to undermine our democracy.

In 2001, Ms. Arnwine represented African descendants from the Americas in helping to draft provisions of the program for action of the UN World Conference Against Racism, Racial Discrimination, Xenophobia and related Intolerance in Durban, South Africa.

In 2000, she convened the third national conference of African American Women in the Law in Washington, D.C. Some 250 participants in 15 workshops provided input into the preparation of a Report and Action Agenda for advocacy before the UN General Assembly Special Session on Women.

In 1995, Ms. Arnwine served as the national convener of the National Conference on African American Women and the Law held in Washington, D.C. and subsequently led a delegation to the UN's NGO Forum and Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing. Her efforts there contributed to a UN Platform for Action that provides protection for women who confront multiple forms of discrimination.

She has received numerous national, regional and local awards. In 2015, Ms. Arnwine received the prestigious "Charles Hamilton Houston Medallion" award along with Co-honoree Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

During the National Bar Association's 2014 Annual Convention, Ms. Arnwine received the Vince Monroe Townsend, Jr., Legends Award and the Women Lawyers Division's Walking the Walk: Women Lawyers Still Making It Happen Award. In 2013, she received the Feminist Majority Foundation's Fearless Trailblazer Award and during the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation's (CBCF) 2013 Annual Legislative Conference, the CBCF, the women members of the CBCF and the Sojourner Truth Legacy Project awarded Ms. Arnwine with the Sojourner Truth, "Woman of Truth" Award. In May 2013, she received the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights' coveted Hubert H. Humphrey Civil and Human Rights Award and in March 2013, Trice Edney Communications, LLC honored her with its inaugural Stateswoman for Justice Award.

In October 2011, she was one of five recipients of the prestigious Gruber International Justice Prize for her excellence in defending and promoting civil rights and gender equity throughout the U.S. In April 2011, the National Bar Association bestowed upon Ms. Arnwine the esteemed Gertrude E. Rush Award and in March 2011, she received the National Black Law Students Association's prestigious Sadie T. M. Alexander Award. In 2009, Ms. Arnwine received two

prominent awards: the Washington D.C. Freedom's Sisters Award (sponsored by Ford Motor Company, the Smithsonian Institution and Cincinnati Museum Center which honors contemporary leaders who have fought for equality for people of color) and the Keeper of the Flame Award from the Boston Lawyers' Committee.

In 2008, Ms. Arnwine was selected as a prestigious Rockwood Institute Leadership Fellow. She is also the recipient of the National Bar Association's Equal Justice Award and the C. Francis Stradford Award in 2007, the highest honor bestowed by that organization. In 2002, she received the Charlotte E. Ray Award from the Greater Washington Area Chapter, Women Lawyers Division of the National Bar Association.

Ms. Arnwine is a featured columnist with Trice Edney News Wire and serves as a frequent conference orator. She has penned numerous articles and is regularly quoted and featured by national and local media outlets such as the American Bar Association (ABA) publications, the New York Times, the Washington Post, MSNBC and NBC Network News, Rev. Jesse Jackson's "Keep Hope Alive" radio show, Sirius Satellite Radio shows, BET, TV One, Radio One and other major national and local media, including many African American newspapers, magazines, radio stations and Web sites. She is active on social media on Twitter and Facebook.

Ms. Arnwine launched "Igniting Change with Barbara Arnwine" in March 2015 on Radio One's WOL 1450 AM. The hour-long show, which airs on Tuesdays from 12-1 p.m. EST, provides provocative and empowering information and discussion designed to ignite change and inspire action in achieving racial justice, social justice and equality.

Ms. Arnwine is board vice-chair of the National Coalition to Abolish the Death Penalty and serves on the board of directors of MomsRising and Independent Sector. She is an honorary board member of Welcome.us and is also a member of the American Bar Association's Section of Individual Rights and Responsibilities.

In 2013, she received the Feminist Majority Foundation's Fearless Trailblazer Award and during the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation's (CBCF) 2013 Annual Legislative Conference, the CBCF, the women members of the CBCF and the Sojourner Truth Legacy Project awarded Ms. Arnwine with the Sojourner Truth, Woman of Truth award. In May 2013, she received the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights' coveted Hubert H. Humphrey Civil and Human Rights Award and, in March 2013, Trice Edney Communications, LLC honored her with its inaugural Stateswoman for Justice award.

Arnwine is a graduate of Scripps College and Duke University School of Law.

## Panelists and Moderators



**Bobbin Singh** is the founding Executive Director of Oregon Justice Resource Center (OJRC). He was born and raised in Atlanta, GA., and deeply inspired by the great figures of the civil rights movement in the South, often joking that as an Atlantan the first names he learned as a child were Dr. Martin Luther King, Andrew Young, Hosea Williams, and John Lewis.

Bobbin moved to Portland in 2003, studying for his Bachelor's at Portland State University and his JD at Lewis & Clark Law School. After graduating from Lewis & Clark in 2011, he started Oregon Justice Resource Center. Bobbin believes that mass incarceration, including over incarceration, mass conviction, and wrongful convictions, is in fact the greatest civil rights crisis of our time and we must all take ownership of it. He argues that for individual rights to have any meaning, we must protect them for everyone, without exception.

Bobbin manages OJRC, oversees staff, volunteers and all programs, and serves as our principal spokesperson. Working with our Board of Directors, he sets policy and direction for OJRC. He served on the Board of Directors for the ACLU of Oregon from 2011-2017 (holding a number of leadership positions, including serving on the Executive Committee) and is currently a member of the Oregon Council on Civil Rights.



**Julia Yoshimoto** is Project Director and Attorney with the Women's Justice Project of the OJRC. Originally from Hawai'i, Julia worked in the social services field for six years before attending law school. She received her Master of Social Work degree from the University of Hawai'i-Mānoa. She worked primarily with low-income clients in the areas of behavioral health and drug addiction. Through this work, she became acutely aware of the need for accessible, high-quality, and compassionate legal services for marginalized individuals. She is dedicated to using her law degree to increase

access to justice by strengthening the bridge between legal services and social services. She has fulfilled her goal of collaborating with a social service organization serving low income clients and expanding its services to include identifying clients' legal needs and providing quality legal assistance through our partnerships with MercyCorps Northwest and Red Lodge Transition Services.

Yoshimoto is a graduate of Carleton College, received her Masters from the University Hawai'i-Mānoa and her JD from Lewis & Clark Law School.



**Kate Gonsalves** serves as Political Director for the OJRC. Kate moved to Portland in 1996 having grown up in Hawaii. For the next decade she led political campaigns with community groups, progressive nonprofits, and unions in multiple states including directing campaign strategy for the Wellstone Democratic Renewal Club in California.

After receiving her master's degree in politics as a Rotary Scholar at the University of British Columbia, Kate returned to Portland in 2010. Prior to joining OJRC, she built political programs and lobbied for the American Federation of Teachers along with advancing ballot measure campaigns at Our Oregon.

Kate is passionate about decreasing systemic inequalities in the justice system. Her commitment to criminal justice reform stems from her work with Dr. David Baldus and the American Civil Liberties Union linking race and death penalty sentencing along with coursework examining race and mass incarceration under Dr. Angela Davis.



**Serena Stoudamire Wesley** is Director of The Office Diversity, and Inclusion/Affirmative Action in Governor Kate Brown's administration. Serena's team is responsible for the statewide work of Affirmative Action, Economic and Business Equity, and Community Engagement.

Serena has over 20 years of extensive experience building and sustaining programs. She has a knack for objectively determining resources for success and sustainability.

Serena has had success in nonprofit leadership, community relations, and government.

Serena Stoudamire Wesley was the policy director for equity and community engagement in the state's Chief Education Office where she developed policy strategies to achieve desired outcomes for Oregon students, formed networks of partners to empower and educate diverse communities, and provided equity training. Serena is a proven leader who mobilizes diverse communities and stakeholders to address inequities and barriers to opportunity – from education to health to employment.

On November 2013, she was appointed as Consul of Protection and Legal Affairs, at the Consulate of Mexico in Portland. As part of her duties Helietta and her team, work to monitor and protect the rights and interests of Mexican nationals in Oregon and southern Washington.

## **The Power of Women Lawyers In Transforming the Legal Sector!**

This presentation is designed to elucidate the role of the legal system in perpetuating gender and racial discrimination in the U.S. and the strategies that lawyers especially women lawyers can undertake to transform this present-day reality into a new and more just legal sector. Foremost in this presentation will be highlights of the national conversation on racial disparities in our legal system and how issues of race, ethnicity and gender identity impact our national and Oregon court systems.

In particular, the speech will feature a slide show that will track how theories of racial and gender hierarchy became incorporated into the U.S. Constitution, the first Oregon Constitutions and federal and state law over the past centuries and shadow our current legal sector. The presentation will begin with a discussion heavily focusing on the legal theories which justified the three foundational pillars of gender and racial inequality including, Native American genocide and land theft; the Slave Trade and Slavery; and Colonialism.

Besides examining cases embodying racial hierarchy, patriarchy and White supremacy, the presentation will examine the peculiar development of gender inequality jurisprudence and the special issues of Intersectionality of race, gender, class, LGBTQIA and disability. There will be a brief overview of the Reconstruction Era Constitution Amendments, Slavery By Another Name, Jim and Jane Crow era, the Civil Rights and Women Rights Movement, new Anti-Discrimination laws and current legal issues. After tracing this historical evolution, the presentation will explore the pressing equality issues of today including racial and discrimination embodied in existing law; high standards of liability; deficient remedial contexts; gaps in the law; implicit bias in the Court system; economic barriers imposed by the criminal justice system; and under-representation of women as judges. Other issues to be covered state statutes permitting rapists to seek custody; gender stereotypes; intersectional stereotypes; unequal pay; tech sector lawsuits; domestic violence; blatant internet discrimination; mass incarceration of women of color; sexual assault by police; healthcare and reproductive rights; and more. The speech will end by looking at creative ways of re-envisioning and transforming the legal sector including the Kellogg Foundation's Truth, Racial Healing and Transformation Enterprise; Say Her Name, Restorative Justice, Incorporating International Constitutional and Human Rights Standards, Ending Voter Suppression and other key strategies.

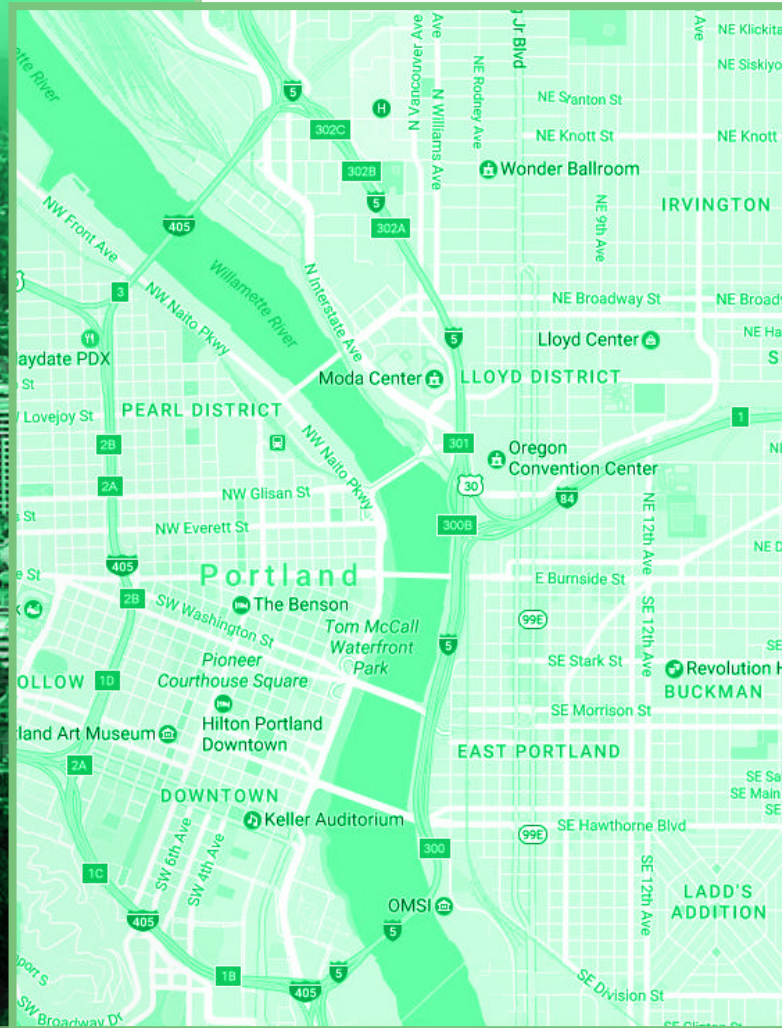

# Introduction

When considering criminal justice reform, the media and many of us are still primarily focused on the roles of the police and the federal government. Much attention has been appropriately paid to the lives lost and families torn apart in police shootings around the country as well as positions taken by President Trump and members of his administration on criminal justice reform.

What is often overlooked, however, is the significant power and responsibility of “down-ballot” elected officials such as county commissioners, district attorneys and school board members. These actors play a direct part in the systems that contribute to over-incarceration. They may run for election unopposed and their decisions can easily escape public attention. But these decisions,

be they about disciplinary policies, discretionary budget appropriations, or charging practices, have a direct, far-reaching, and often immediate impact at the local level.<sup>1</sup> The daily practices of these stakeholders play their part in perpetuating racial disparities in our criminal justice system and in shaping outcomes.

Simply put, meaningful criminal justice reform is unlikely to be achieved without buy-in from local level stakeholders. These decision makers, particularly sheriffs, district attorneys, and judges, hold the keys to the front door of the correctional system. County and municipal actors are responsible for many of the decisions that funnel people through that front door because people who are sentenced to state prisons are prosecuted locally. These local actors have

discretion over whether to stop, search, arrest, fine, divert, or charge someone and how long a sentence should be sought.

By refocusing our attention from the federal and state level to our local communities, we can see that locally-elected leaders at the city and county levels have tremendous power to drastically change systems of over-criminalization. This guide aims to expose the opportunity and responsibility that local elected leaders have to bring about criminal justice reform. It will also provide a framework to help you seek accountability from your local level officials and representatives.



# How to use this guide

This Guide focuses on the period leading up to incarceration as the foundation and critical phase of our system of mass incarceration. It was developed as a tool for advocates who are concerned with ending mass incarceration. Once we admit that over-incarceration is a shameful failure and has a disparate racial impact, we must then take on the tremendous challenge of

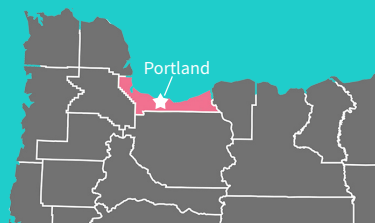
transforming this mammoth system with its myriad parts.

The scale of this undertaking could easily feel paralyzing. To overcome this problem, we have created this Advocacy Guide to help you break it down into clearly defined and manageable tasks. You can use this Guide to identify the decision makers who have authority to make changes

around particular issues as well as their “pressure points”, or the ways in which they can be influenced. These tasks may take many forms, such as writing to elected officials, attending budget hearings, or voting for change in local elections. Our hope is that you will find opportunities to more readily move your local decision-makers toward ending mass incarceration.

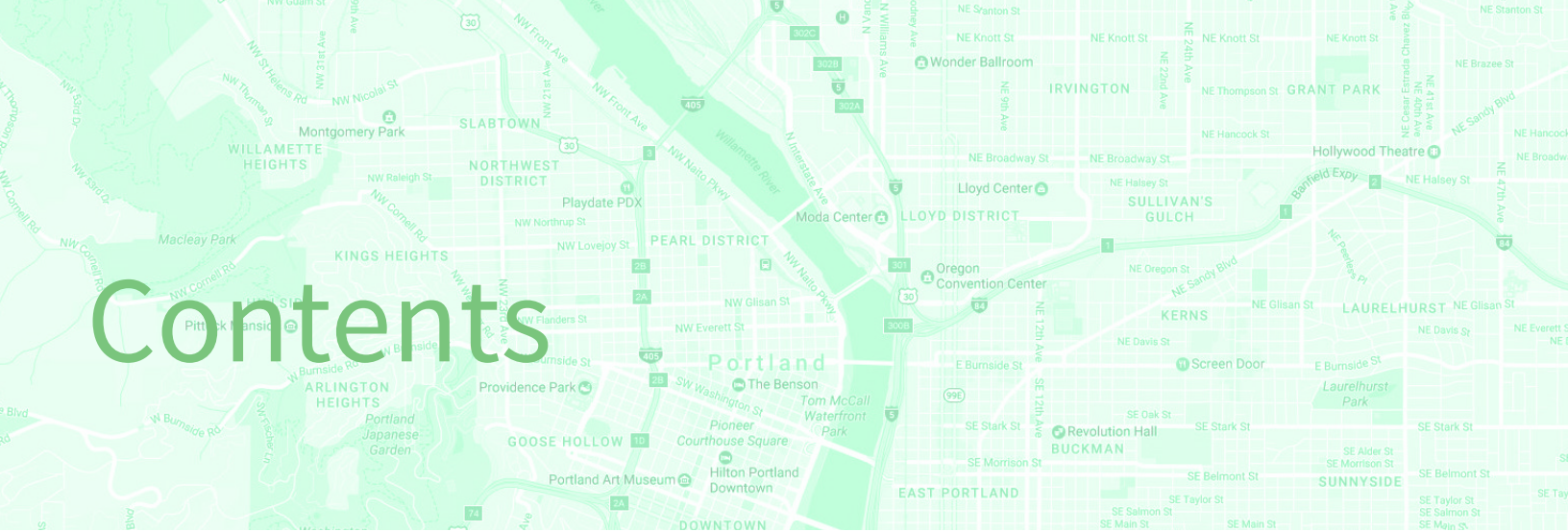


Multnomah County in northwest Oregon is the state's most populous county (799,766 residents). It is home to the cities of Portland (639,863 residents), Gresham (111,523 residents), Troutdale (16,617 residents), Fairview (9,290 residents), Wood Village (4,016 residents), and Maywood Park (828 residents).<sup>2</sup>



## Multnomah County and the city of Portland

**You might be surprised to learn that a large majority of incarcerated individuals in the U.S. are sentenced in highly populated urban areas that are typically considered progressive strongholds.**<sup>3</sup> For that reason, we have decided to use Multnomah County and the city of Portland and their school districts as an example of a local area where the ideas in this guide can be implemented. Other counties may have distinct governing structures that pose their own unique opportunities and challenges, including preemption.<sup>4</sup>



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# Rethinking criminal justice at the local level

## SCOPE OF THE PROBLEM

With five percent of the world's population and nearly 25 percent of its prisoners, the United States has the dubious distinction of being the planet's leading jailer.<sup>5</sup> At the local level, jail admissions have nearly doubled, with almost 12 million admissions each year.<sup>6</sup> The hyper-criminalization of Americans, particularly those who are poor, black, or brown, has become normalized as punishment has grown more severe. In the last 40 years, the national prison population grew by more than 500 percent.<sup>7</sup>

In Oregon, despite our progressive reputation, we mirror the national trend toward over-incarceration. In January 1987, Oregon had a prison population of 4001.<sup>8</sup> 30 years later, in January 2017, the prison population had more than tripled

to 14,617.<sup>9</sup> Even allowing for the general population increase, this growth is staggering, with roughly 83,000 Oregonians under some form of correctional control.<sup>10</sup>

## REASON FOR GUARDED OPTIMISM

Despite the results of the recent presidential election, momentum for reform seems to be building. The 2016 elections delivered a tremendous surge of support for forward-thinking criminal justice reforms at the local level. Voters in multiple states passed ballot measures tackling criminal justice issues such as parole for nonviolent felons, bail reform, and the reclassification of some felonies as misdemeanors.<sup>11</sup> For the first time in recent history, voters in more than a dozen states ousted a significant number of incumbent district

attorneys and sheriffs in favor of reform-minded candidates.<sup>12</sup> Grassroots activists in Washington and California have made major progress in encouraging city councils to prevent construction of new jails.<sup>13 14</sup> These recent local-level victories illustrate how, if the broader goal of the criminal justice reform community is to bring about systemic change, a focus solely on the powers of the President would be short-sighted.

## WHY OREGON?

In contrast to focusing on the federal administration, a local-level approach to criminal justice reform provides the most promising path away from over-incarceration. Out of the roughly 2,500 counties across the nation, urban centers that are major population hubs hold the most

potential to transform systems of mass incarceration. A focus on progressive counties and cities with large populations can drive down admissions, transform practices, and reshape the criminal justice landscape for an entire state.

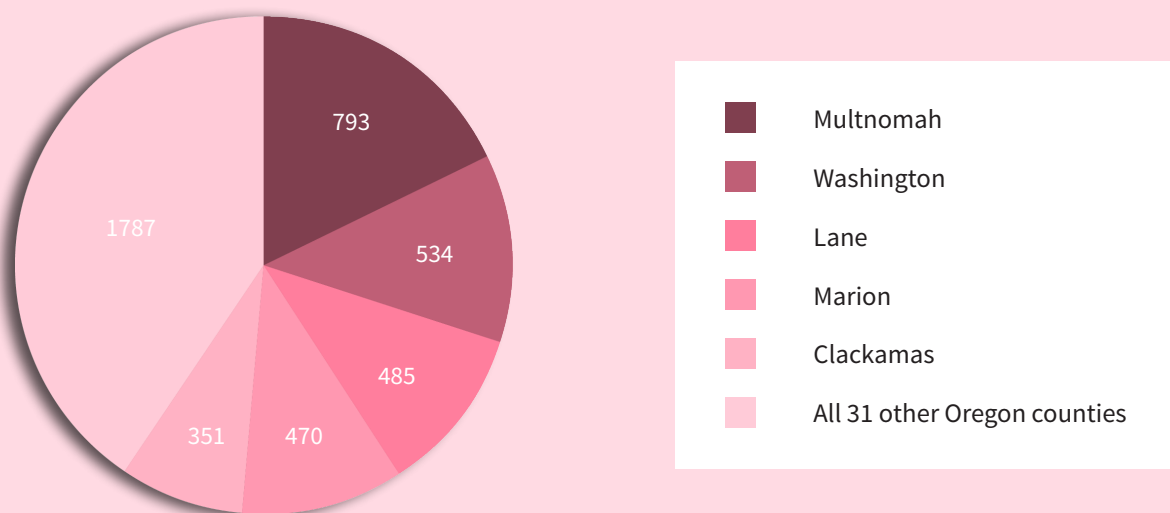
Growing awareness of the gross racial disparities that exist within Oregon prisons is fueling a debate over what stakeholders in the justice system can do to address this problem. What is less talked about is that an overwhelming number of people of color entering the system are being sent there from some of Oregon's most progressive cities and counties. These jurisdictions may not have the

largest disparities between the number of people of color they send to prison and the size of those ethnic and racial groups within their general populations. But, as the chart below shows, the sheer number of people these cities and counties send to prison relative to less populous places means their local level stakeholders have the greatest ability to address the disproportionate impact of mass incarceration on communities of color.<sup>15</sup> Nearly one in five Oregonians who went to state prison in 2016 was sent there from Multnomah County.

Public opinion polling demonstrates that a preventative-rehabilitative

approach to crime control is overwhelmingly favored by Oregonians, with 61.4 percent in favor according to polling.<sup>16</sup> Recently, voters bucked the national trend by electing progressives more favorable to criminal justice reform in the executive, Senate, and House, and by electing the most diverse crop of legislators in state history including more women, queer people, and people of color.<sup>17</sup> As Oregon addresses the real-world budget impact of ever-growing prison numbers risking the opening of new prisons, this is an opportune time to encourage local stakeholders to embrace less punitive but still effective alternatives to decrease admissions.<sup>18</sup>

OREGON STATE PRISON INTAKE COUNTS BY COUNTY, 2016<sup>15</sup>



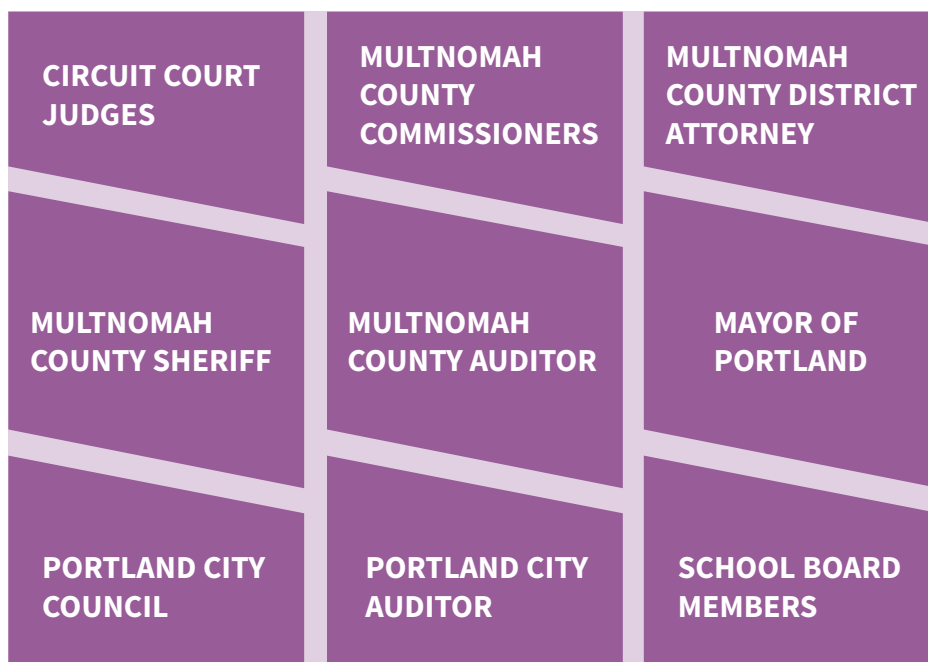


# The stars are aligned: we are ready for change

At the local level the stars are aligned for change. As a result of recent elections, the Multnomah County Commission is made up of a majority of people of color and entirely female. For the first time, Portland's auditor has more autonomy, there is a new mayor, a new police chief, a new sheriff, and there

will be a new superintendent of Portland Public Schools all answerable to one of the most progressive constituent bases in the nation.<sup>19</sup> Now is the time to persuade local stakeholders to switch to alternatives that may be less punitive but are still effective. Below are the nine key stakeholders you need to know

about because they have the greatest capacity to influence the local criminal justice issues you care about. As you read this guide, you'll learn more about the powers of these stakeholders and how they interact with one another as well as how you can help shape their decisions.







# Challenges for reformers

## COMPLEXITY OF THE SYSTEM MAKES IT DIFFICULT TO PLUG IN TO ACHIEVE REFORM

Recent public opinion polling shows that we are ready for new approaches to criminal justice.<sup>31</sup> Yet, it can be frustrating and confusing to deal with the numerous uncoordinated and often autonomous actors associated with “the system”. Despite the significant amount of tax dollars spent on public safety, the public is both ill-informed about, and highly impacted by, the multiple agencies and actors that make up the justice system.<sup>20</sup> This maze of bureaucracy makes it difficult to pinpoint where accountability lies. With such an array of actors and institutions, the majority of reform energy tends to focus on police. This attention to law enforcement is understandable given the instances of excessive use of force, the visibility of the police

on our streets and the frequency of our interactions with them.<sup>21</sup> However, without the backing of those they answer to, expecting accountability from unelected frontline employees is fraught with difficult and potentially meager impact.

## NO SINGLE PERSON IN CHARGE

There is no one person in charge of the criminal justice system in the United States. Instead, criminal justice is often impacted by multiple stakeholders, each with varying degrees of discretion and influence. If you live in Portland, you may fall under the jurisdiction of the federal system, state prisons, county jails, Oregon State Police, the Portland Police Bureau, Oregon Health Sciences University police, TriMet police, Port of Portland Police, probation and parole divisions, and other agencies and services such as

drug courts and halfway houses, probation and community sanctions, and neighborhood prosecutors. In addition, there is a military criminal justice system, immigration detention, tribal courts with some criminal jurisdiction, and a separate system for juveniles.

These agencies and individuals are often the first to come to mind when thinking about criminal justice. When looking “upstream”, it becomes apparent that local elected officials play an oversized role in setting justice-related priorities and outcomes long before they are enforced. The focus and main priority of this advocacy guide is to build on current conversations focused on police, and take the discussion a step further to name the locally elected actors with the authority to bring about real culture change.



# Power mapping framework

## A PATH FORWARD: POWER MAPPING

The Oregon Justice Resource Center relies on a power mapping framework, long used by social justice organizers across the nation, but rarely applied to local criminal justice issues. This framework is particularly useful in the justice realm where identifying the best approach to transforming complex bureaucracies can be overwhelming. By identifying the many stakeholders with the authority to enact reform, the framework of power mapping serves to increase transparency, home in on realistic solutions, and move the conversation away from “tinkering” around the edges of a problem. An example starting point for mapping criminal justice issues is:

1. Identify an issue or problem
2. Identify decision-makers
3. Create an action plan.

### Step one: identify the problem

There are many ways to undertake power mapping. The process can be useful for individuals but is most effectively done in groups. First, agree upon an issue or problem. Then, gather information and familiarize yourself with the topic. Find out everything about the issue. What information do you have and what additional research questions do you need to answer? What progress has already been made on the issue?

### Step two: identify decision-makers

The second step is to determine who are the key decision-makers on your issue. It may be helpful to determine the spheres of influence by drawing a grid of relational power lines. Who is in charge? To whom do they answer? Who supports the issue? Who can be influential? Who can be supportive? Who is most impacted? Are there associations, issue organizations or donors who can exert influence? Mapping relationships allows you to determine spheres of influence along with pressure points.

### Step three: make a plan and take action

Create an action plan including development of priorities and goals, setting timelines, identifying your best messenger(s), adding key dates to calendars, and agreeing tactics to effect change. Get started and keep in mind that elected officials work for you. This step can be as simple as a phone call to local officials voicing support or opposition to a policy. It can be a more time-intensive campaign in partnership with other advocacy organizations. Even if you are confident that an official agrees with you it is important to thank them for making progress on issues you care about. This can provide them with cover and encourage them to go further.

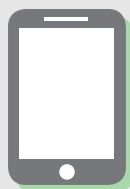


# Types of effective action



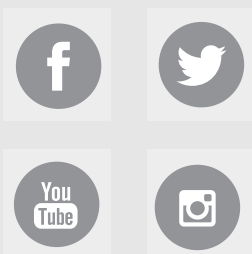
## FACE-TO-FACE MEETINGS

Office visits or conversations over coffee are effective especially when they come with a clear “ask” (request). Elected officials are frequently lobbied by influential special interest groups. This makes it even more important for them to hear directly from their constituents. Calling the office staff line and asking for a meeting only takes a moment. Be courteous to staff members who act as gatekeepers and sometimes draft memos and inform the elected official about your position.



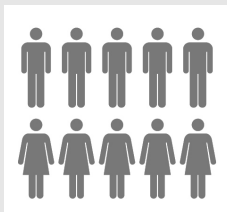
## COORDINATED CALLS

Calls can make a big impact and take little time. Calls tied to a specific action in coordination with other groups are the most impactful, but even individual calls are noted. Elected officials notice how many calls they receive and about which issues. It can be helpful to write a quick script before calling to make sure you cover all your points. Most likely, you will not speak to the elected official directly but their staffer will take a message to pass on.



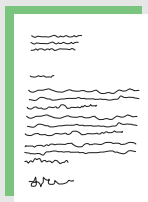
## SOCIAL MEDIA

Activists are increasingly turning to social media to engage. Twitter allows elected officials to be tagged and Facebook has launched a way for users to contact their representatives. Facebook Live, the site’s live video streaming service, is growing as a platform to broadcast townhalls and record elected officials’ statements on issues. Following and commenting on their pages provides feedback and allows you to stay up to date on where they stand. Find their campaign pages and start following them.



## SHOWING UP

Testifying at hearings and other local public events, joining subcommittees, and becoming a recognizable “face” are important in holding officials accountable. There are various ways to make an impact: by attending hearings and joining Budget Advisory Committees (CBACs) at the county level or Budget Advisory Committees (BACs) at city level. Check local government websites for schedules to find opportunities to engage.



### THE POWER OF THE WRITTEN WORD

Writing to your elected officials including by letter, signing petitions, or emailing is another good way to engage. Bulk email campaigns are less effective but letters frequently generate a response. Stressing that you are a constituent is the most effective way to be taken seriously. Many organizations such as Moveon.org and Color of Change send regular action alerts and petitions.



### SEEKING PRESS

Op-eds, press releases, letters to the editor, and earned media can be excellent ways to generate awareness and attention for an issue. Elected officials are always concerned with how they are perceived in the community. Local papers publish criteria for submitting op-eds for publication. In Multnomah County, both *The Oregonian* and the *Portland Tribune* publish guest opinion pieces.



### VOTING AND ELECTORAL ACTION

Learning about when candidates are up for re-election comes first. Recruiting candidates to run, holding candidate interviews, volunteering to knock on doors and make phone calls to candidates you support, donating, reading up on candidate positions, and voting can make a big impact. Visit the Oregon Secretary of State's My Vote website to check whether your voter registration is up to date. Don't forget that even if you are on probation or parole, you still have the right to vote in Oregon.



### OTHER FORMS OF ACTIVISM

There are numerous other creative ways to engage with elected officials. Some ideas include: art, protests, marches, civil disobedience, demonstrations, impact litigation, music benefit concerts, strikes, ballot measure campaigns, recall elections, boycotts, hacktivism, hosting forums, and holding events.

# Case study

More than 150 cities and counties across the US along with half the states have passed legislation commonly referred to as “Ban the Box” laws.<sup>31</sup> These laws aim to remove barriers to employment for people with criminal histories. They increase the chances of people with such histories becoming employed by prohibiting the inclusion of questions on employment applications asking whether applicants have prior felony convictions. 2015 saw Portland and Oregon join the nationwide momentum toward reform by passing their own versions of these laws. The campaign around “Ban the Box” in Portland offers a model for how you can plan, organize, and carry out a campaign around your chosen issue.

## Identifying the problem

People with criminal histories face significant barriers to finding employment. According to the National Employment Law Project, nearly one in three US adults has an arrest or conviction that may show up on their record during routine employment background checks.<sup>32</sup> Employers often ask job applicants to disclose whether they have anything on their record, asking them to “check the box” if they have prior convictions. For those who check the box, this information may be used to dismiss their application out of hand, without regard to learning more about what rehabilitation the applicant may have undergone, how long ago their conviction was, how serious it was, or how far they can show they have changed since that time. Candidates may not get the chance to explain their convictions because they never make it to the interview stage of recruitment.

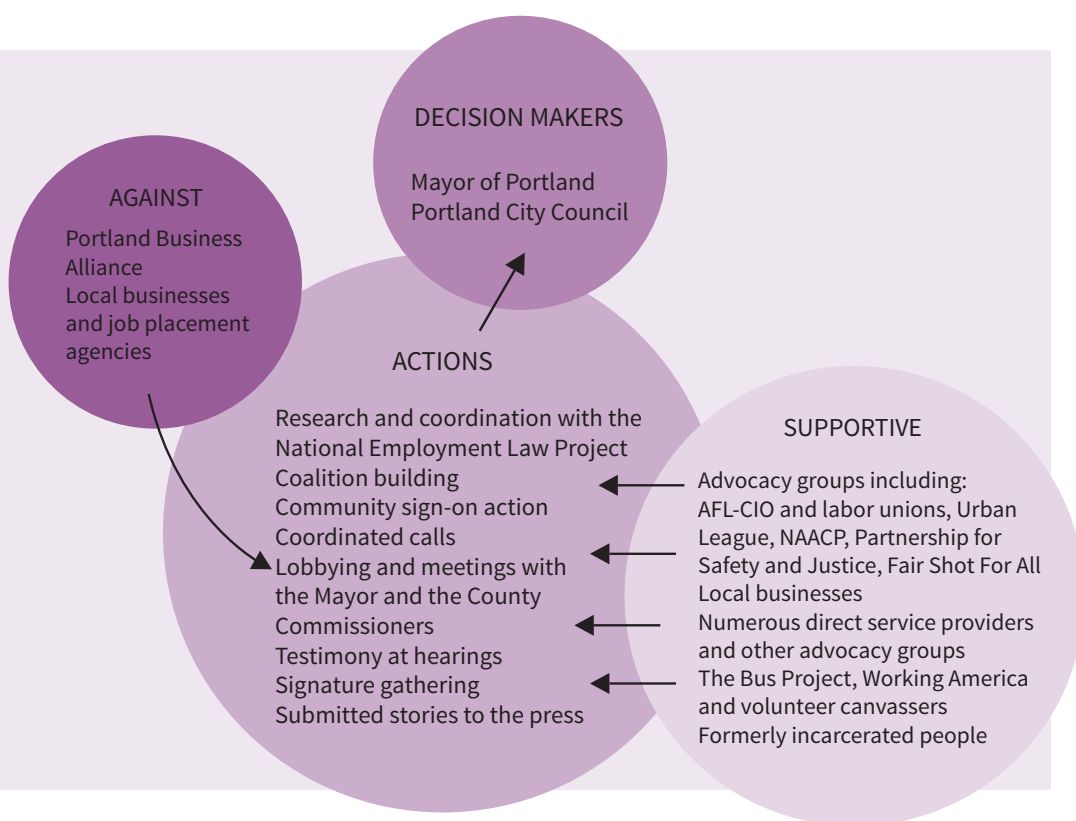
In recognition of the way that applicants with criminal histories are missing out on employment opportunities, the “Ban the Box” movement was born. It aims to persuade jurisdictions to prohibit the inclusion of questions about criminal histories at the application stage, although it does not prevent employers from learning about them later in the process, once candidates have had a fair shot at gaining an interview where they can provide an explanation and context to their record.

## Identifying decision-makers

The Mayor and the Commissioners were the decision-makers since they have the power to pass city ordinances.

## Taking action

This chart shows how supportive and opposing groups took action to influence the decision made by the Mayor of Portland and the Portland City Council on “Ban the Box”. The campaign in support involved coordination of multiple local and national actors for focused advocacy, media, campaigning, and public education.



## Outcome

In 2015, after months of organizing and coordinated action by community groups such as the Urban League of Portland, Fair Shot Oregon and the Oregon AFL-CIO, the Portland City Council unanimously approved a new “Ban the Box” ordinance.<sup>33</sup> The regulations were stronger than the state policy passed earlier that year. Now, most Portland private-sector businesses with more than five employees cannot ask about a prospective employee’s criminal history before offering them a job.

While widely applauded as a step forward, studies on how “Ban the Box” laws are working in practice around the country have raised concerns employers may end up discriminating broadly against particular racial or ethnic groups to try to circumvent the law.<sup>34</sup> Removing barriers to employment is important but it is not the end of the road: there is more to be done to tackle entrenched racism in hiring practices.

# actions you can take now

## ..... EDUCATE YOURSELF .....

1. Educate yourself and others about the justice system with special

focus on historically marginalized groups, crimmigration and LGBTQ history. Read books such as *Just Mercy* and *The New Jim Crow* and learn from documentaries such as *13<sup>th</sup>*. Subscribe to The Marshall Project's email news roundup to get daily updates on criminal justice issues.



2. Stay informed about local policies, ordinances, changes to the charter, budget appropriations, upcoming hearings and bargaining around the police union contract.

3. Attend conferences and events that have been sponsored by community partners. Learn about and support intersectionality to build power as well as avoid making progress at the expense of another group.

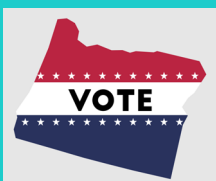
4. Support investigative journalism. Seek out alternative analysis behind fearmongering use of statistics. Track issues, read up on why it is important to reform the entire system of over-incarceration, not just the so-called "nons" (non violent/non serious/non sexual offenses.)

5. Know your rights. When an officer contacts you ask, "Am I free to go?" When police ask to pat you down, look in the trunk of your car, or question you, do not consent without a lawyer.



## ..... PARTICIPATE .....

6. Register and vote. Vote on down-ballot races. Read up on the powers and platforms of local candidates. Seek ballot measure information from a nonprofit organization you trust before voting. Many Oregonians now regret voting in favor of mandatory minimum sentencing ballot measures.



7. Run for office. Enroll in a candidate training program to prepare yourself. Here in Oregon, several programs exist, including those provided by Emerge Oregon, the Oregon Labor Candidate School, The Bus Project, and Amplify.



8. Show up informed for jury duty. Educate yourself on forensic science advances before you do.



9. Dismantle white supremacy and hate speech. Check your privilege. Intervene if you witness bullying or intimidation. Ensure those most impacted are front-and-center in decision making.

10. Vote your pocket book by supporting companies and financial institutions that share your values. The purchasing decisions you make every day do impact the issues you care about.



## ..... BUILD COMMUNITY .....

11. Get involved and join local criminal justice reform organizations (see the resource list on page 23) and find out which campaigns you can plug into. Offer your skill sets. Mobilize a group around a specific criminal justice reform issue at the local level.

13. Stop calling the police. Find alternative dispute resolution techniques where possible for non-emergencies.

14. Donate to criminal justice reform organizations. If you believe that mass incarceration is wrong, show your much-needed support for those who are working to end it.



15. Examine your philosophies around parenting and punishment. Develop your conflict resolution skills. Get involved at local schools and help to establish or expand restorative justice programs.

12. Learn about trauma and acknowledge that people deserve to be given second chances. Don't judge someone solely on the worst thing they ever did in life. Write to an incarcerated person. Visit someone. Hire a formerly incarcerated person. Rent to a formerly incarcerated person.

17. Record and report unfair treatment by police and immigration officials. Download the ACLU's Mobile Justice app to your phone so you are ready.

18. Stop using words such as "felon" or "convict" which carry lifelong negative connotations. Instead, use "people-first" terms such as "formerly incarcerated person". Language matters. 34

19. Protest and speak out, organize, write, retweet, share, repost social media posts, sign petitions, write op-eds and letters to the editor, comment on articles published online.



20. Follow your tax dollars. Take an assessment of how many diversion opportunities and community supports exist in your neighborhood. Bring the number up when attending budget hearings. Join oversight committees, budget advisory committees and public watchdog groups.





# Summary

A growing number of Americans now strongly believe that reducing the prison and jail population will make communities safer through diverting investment to crime prevention and rehabilitation.<sup>36</sup> The next step is transforming these beliefs into action by ensuring city and county budgets, policies, and practices reflect these beliefs. With the recognition that too many people have been criminalized, and that sentences have become overly punitive beyond a point of effectiveness, comes a push for radical transformation starting in the communities where stakeholders in the justice system live, work, and answer to the people who elect them.

Oregon counties and cities have the capacity to more effectively

treat addiction, mental illness, poverty, and crime at a fraction of the human and fiscal costs of confinement. Elected officials can use less punitive alternatives to address the root causes of crime while holding people who break the law accountable. Efforts underway to build cross-collaborative partnerships by the Local Public Safety Coordinating Committees are a good start but need to go further. In order to correct the course away from the era of racialized mass incarceration, local elected officials have an opportunity to support new initiatives and a new direction. It will take sustained pressure and the backing of community advocates to ensure they do.

Elected leaders, especially those in the United States' most

populous counties, have the authority to bring about an end to the era of mass incarceration. They can begin changing policy by overhauling state criminal codes, ending local "broken windows" ordinances, and working to repeal mandatory minimums. True change will also require going beyond policy to alter daily practices and protocols such as by giving warnings and offering assistance as an alternative to arrest, diverting instead of pressing charges, allocating funding to pre-adjudication alternatives, and establishing new protocols that have teeth to end police brutality. With the growing recognition that local elected officials hold these tremendous powers comes the chance for Oregonians to demand change.



# INTRODUCTION

Mass incarceration has at last moved to the top of the agenda not only for those working within the justice system but also for many people outside it. Those caught up in the system would no doubt say this increased awareness has been a long time coming but it is still welcome. What we have seen less of, however, is attentiveness to the mass incarceration of women. Indeed it is arguable that women have been greater victims of the trend toward incarcerating a larger number of Americans since their prison numbers have seen faster growth than men's.<sup>2</sup>

Oregon is no exception to this trend. Facing Oregon's female prison system is a number of troubling issues, including: facility and housing deficiencies for both women and girls, increasingly untenable costs due to housing and health care issues, a lack of programming, potential human rights violations, and significant racial and ethnic disparities.

National data indicate that "[i]ncarcerated women are disproportionately women of color...from low-income communities who have been subjected to a disproportionately high rate of violence."<sup>3</sup>

This report seeks to provide the necessary national context for understanding Oregon's incarceration of women. It

will also synthesize the various available data, news and academic reports on Oregon trends in the incarceration and treatment of women in prison. The goal is to provide a one-stop destination for anyone seeking up-to-date information on the women in

Oregon's prisons.

It is also important to understand what this report is not. We have confined ourselves to gathering and presenting information on women imprisoned in Oregon, but not those serving time in jail or in community or alternative sentencing programs. Also, we have not sought to put forward solutions to rapid growth in the numbers of women imprisoned in Oregon within this document. We want this report to provide context to the solutions we are proposing to the over-incarceration of women and we want it to remain relevant and useful for as long as possible. We believe this will be easier to achieve by confining this document to highlighting the data we have - and the missing data we need - about Oregon's incarcerated women.

# THE NATIONAL PICTURE

## WHO ARE OUR WOMEN IN PRISON?

Nationally, our female prison population is made up disproportionately of women of color. In 2014, black women were incarcerated at a rate more than twice that of white women.<sup>4</sup> The ACLU highlights that 30% of incarcerated women are black, though they are only 13% of the general female population.<sup>5</sup> Over the past 15 years or so, racial disproportionality in rates of incarceration has seen promising shrinkage. But a significant portion of that decline is due to rapidly increasing rates of incarceration among white women.<sup>6</sup>

Women in prison are overwhelmingly characterized by histories of abuse, mental illness, drug addiction, poverty, low education attainment, or some combination of these factors, many of which are interrelated.<sup>7</sup> The majority of women in prison also have a history of abuse or trauma, which may include physical, sexual, or intimate

partner abuse, and often begins in childhood.<sup>8,9</sup>

Incarcerated women have greater degrees of morbidity than men and non-incarcerated women, including higher rates of “HIV, cardiovascular disease, and certain types of cancer.”<sup>10,11</sup> A majority of incarcerated women also have a mental health issue. For example, a Bureau of Justice Statistics report found that 73% of incarcerated women surveyed in state prisons have a mental health issue.<sup>12</sup>

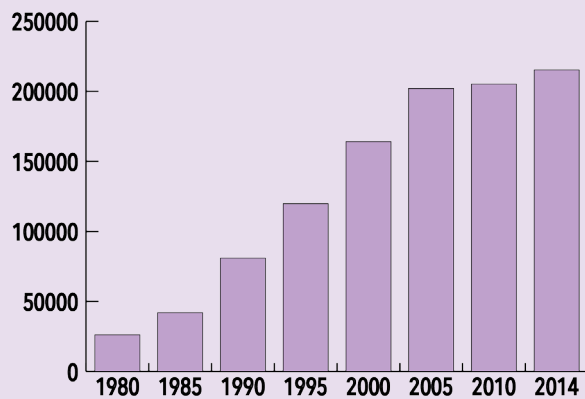
Many of these women have been unable to access the resources they need because of poverty. Research has found that incarcerated women on average have median annual incomes that are 42% lower than those of non-incarcerated women.<sup>13</sup>

Lastly, family and relationships provide further complicating individual risk factors. Most notably, women are more often

the primary carers of children, which comes with a greater financial burden on mothers. From 1991 to 2008, the “number of children under age 18 with a mother in prison ... [has] more than doubled.”<sup>14</sup> The Bureau of Justice Statistics reported in 2000 that roughly two thirds of women in state prisons have a child under the age of eighteen.<sup>15</sup>

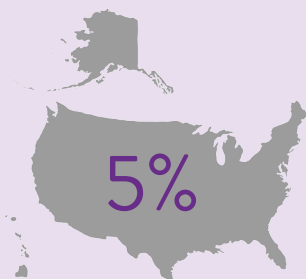


## DATA ON FEMALE INCARCERATION

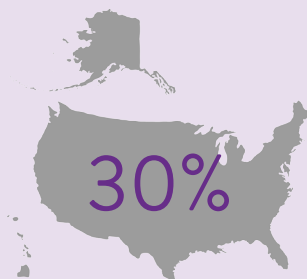


Rise in women's incarceration, 1980-2014<sup>16</sup>

The current rate of incarceration in the US is “more than eight times higher than it was throughout most of the twentieth century.”<sup>19</sup> Our levels of female incarceration are at historic highs and they are rapidly growing.

## UNIQUE PATHWAYS OF WOMEN INTO PRISON

Women intersect with the criminal justice system in ways that are different from men. Although women are being incarcerated at unprecedented rates, they pose a relatively low public safety risk.<sup>20</sup> This is underscored by the type of crimes women generally commit: “women in state prisons are more likely than men to be incarcerated for a drug or property offense” and less likely to be incarcerated for a violent crime.<sup>21</sup> Even within prison, the likelihood of women committing acts of “violence and aggression ... [is] extremely low.”<sup>22</sup>

More so than men, women’s “criminal behavior is often related to their relationships, connections, and disconnections with others.”<sup>23</sup>

*“Women in state prisons are more likely than men to be incarcerated for a drug or property offense” and less likely to be incarcerated for a violent crime.”<sup>21</sup>*

Furthermore, histories of abuse and trauma are intimately tied to mental health issues and drug use, both of which are major factors in women following pathways to prison.

In a survey of 491 randomly selected women from rural and urban jails in 2013, the researchers found that “women with [serious mental illness] reported significantly more victimization and more extensive offending histories than women who did not.”<sup>24</sup> Research indicates that many women are incarcerated for behaviors resulting from poverty, mental illness, and a history of abuse or trauma, and women’s relationships with others play a central role in offending.

# OREGON

## INTRODUCTION

The available research shows that Oregon's women in prison are similar in many respects to incarcerated women nationally. There is a significant amount of research on Oregon's incarceration practices and populations, but relatively little that deals with women specifically. This is perhaps not surprising given that men comprise the majority of Oregon's incarcerated population.<sup>25</sup> The Oregon Department of Corrections (ODOC) provides data on the incarcerated population in Oregon. Depending on the type of data, the information is updated at varying intervals, is relatively

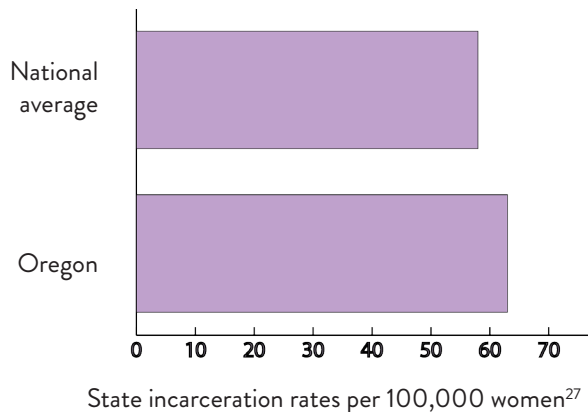
up-to-date, and provides many useful statistics used in this report that are gender-specific. ODOC data provides a snapshot of Oregon's most current incarcerated female population. Other data from various sources provide more analysis of Oregon's incarcerated women. However, there is significant need for more current research and academic commentary on the various pathways to – and policies within – women's intersection with the criminal justice system in Oregon. This section will summarize the available information on Oregon's women in prison, including a review of incarceration trends

and crime types, characteristics of Oregon's incarcerated women, and an overview of Oregon's sole women's prison, Coffee Creek Correctional Facility (CCCF).

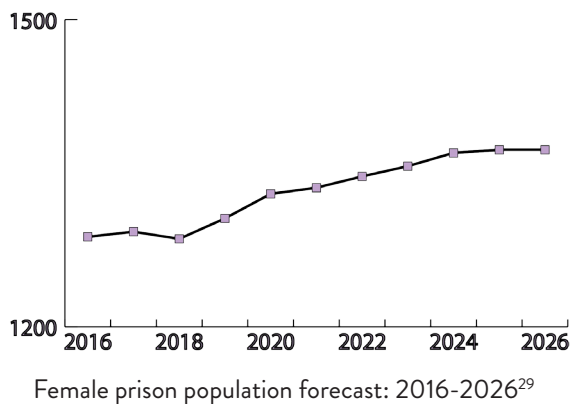
## RATE OF FEMALE INCARCERATION IN OREGON: CURRENT AND PREDICTED



As nationally, female incarceration in Oregon has grown at a rate that makes women one of the fastest growing populations in the criminal justice system.



The rate of female incarceration in Oregon tripled between 1994 and 2014, far out-pacing the rate of growth in male incarceration over the same period.

10 women are serving life without the possibility of parole<sup>34</sup>

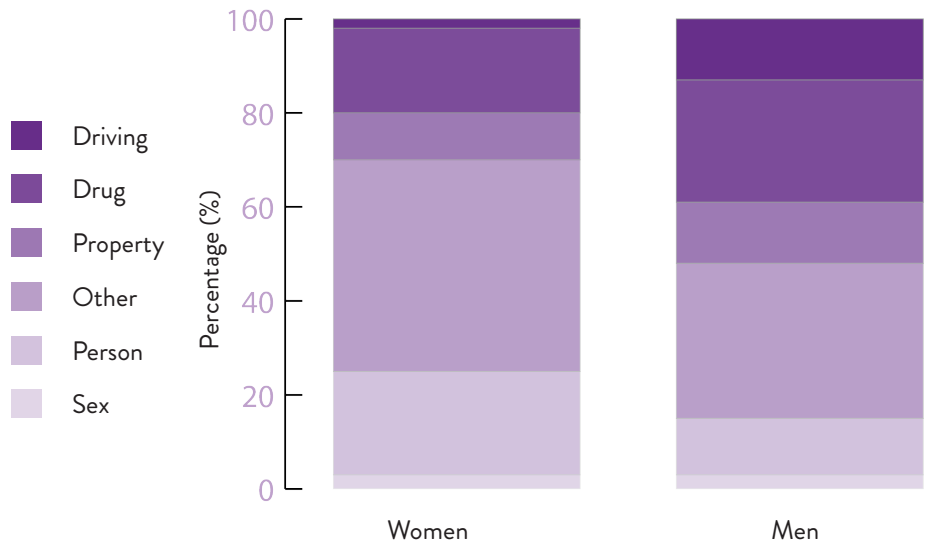

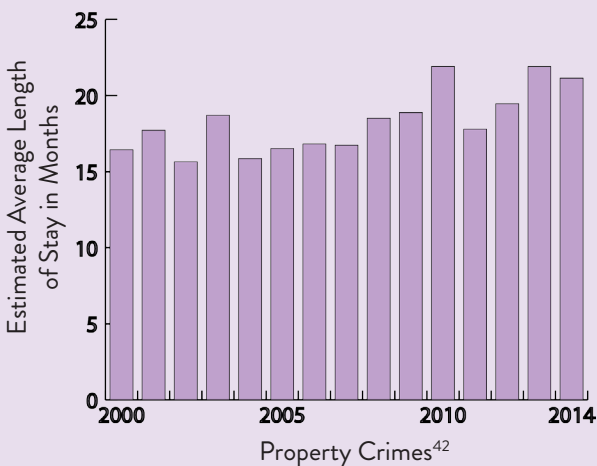
The most recent forecast of adult female prison population growth shows Oregon is expected to add 83 women over the next ten years (starting April 2016).<sup>29</sup> These ten-year forecasts are conducted twice a year. This most recent forecast predicts a slightly higher growth in the adult female prison population. This is explained by “higher-than-expected intakes” of female prisoners.<sup>30</sup> Forecasts cannot account for policy changes that may significantly affect prison populations. Overall, women’s incarceration in Oregon seems to be growing at a steady rate and will likely continue to do so over the next decade – barring policy changes that affect how many women we lock up.<sup>31</sup>

# STATISTICS ON CRIME BY TYPE

The most recent data from the Oregon Department of Corrections show that women in Oregon are incarcerated primarily for nonviolent drug and property offenses.<sup>36</sup> When nonviolent property and drug offenses are put together, they account for well over half of all admissions to Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.<sup>37</sup> In Oregon, property and drug crimes comprise a larger proportion of convictions for women than men.<sup>38</sup> Specifically, person and sex offenses put together accounted for only 20% of all prison intakes for women, compared to 39% for men.<sup>39</sup>



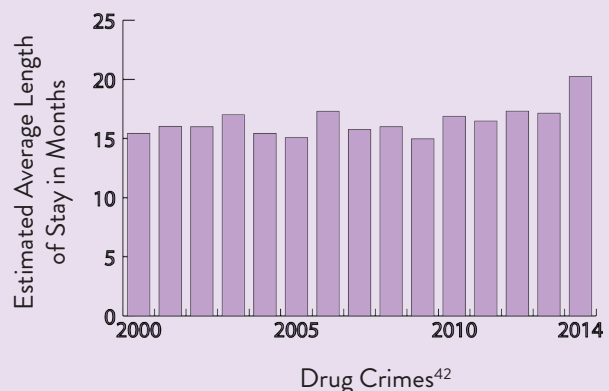
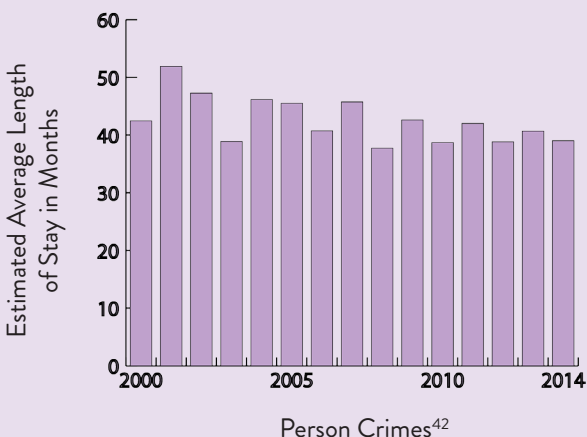
2014 Prison Intakes by Gender and Crime Type



At CCCF, the number of women sentenced for felony property crimes doubled from 2000 to 2011.<sup>40</sup> As a result of Oregon's creation of harsher penalties for property crimes such as ID theft, more women are being incarcerated for longer periods, including for behaviors that historically would not have been punished with imprisonment.<sup>41</sup>

These sentencing trends are reflected in women's average length of stay in prison, which has been increasing over recent years for property and drug crimes and decreasing for violent person offenses.<sup>42</sup>

Oregon's female supervision population (i.e. probation and post-prison supervision) has remained relatively stable between 2006 and 2015, ranging from about 7000-8000 women.<sup>43</sup>





# CHARACTERISTICS OF INCARCERATED WOMEN

## HISTORIES OF ABUSE AND TRAUMA AND THE ROLE OF RELATIONSHIPS

Studies conducted in Oregon in the early 2000s suggested that a significant proportion of women in Oregon's criminal justice system have histories of abuse and trauma. A 2001 study found that at the Multnomah County jail 67% of the women interviewed reported a history of sexual abuse and 79% reported physical abuse.<sup>44</sup> Heidi Steward, Superintendent of CCCF, says: "A lot of the pathways that lead to prison are connected ... more women than men are victimized, and you just see them in a vicious cycle."<sup>45</sup>

In 2007, another study by Western Michigan University looked at women on probation and parole in Lane County, Oregon. Women who answered affirmatively to a number of abuse-related screening questions were interviewed and their data collected.<sup>46</sup> The authors concluded that the women appeared to have experienced "intimate terrorism", including both physical and emotional abuse.<sup>47</sup> Furthermore, the report highlighted that in Lane County, 29% of women on probation or parole reported that they "committed a crime because they were threatened by their partner."<sup>48</sup> This conforms with past studies of incarcerated women that have found "relationships with men were at the core of their offending behavior."<sup>49</sup>

## CHEMICAL DEPENDENCE, DRUG, AND PROPERTY CRIMES

Chemical dependency is a prevalent feature of Oregon's incarcerated women. Drug use and the "problems associated with it are stronger predictors of female rates of criminal activity than male rates."<sup>50</sup> In 2012, more than 800 of CCCF's incarcerated women had a history of drug dependency or addiction.<sup>51</sup> In 1995, research on Oregon offenders funded by the National Institute of Corrections used extensive qualitative interviews and produced observations from offenders and officers alike "that chemical dependency is a leading cause of criminal activity by women."<sup>52</sup> A study at Multnomah County Jail conducted in 1999 found that more than half of the respondents reported having used intravenous drugs and more than two thirds had used crack.<sup>53</sup> In 2012, an article in the "Willamette Week" newspaper reported that at CCCF, "89% of the inmate population entered prison addicted to drugs or alcohol."<sup>54</sup>

Drug dependency is also a common precursor or causal factor for other crimes. In Oregon, there is a direct connection between chemical dependency and theft (the primary property offense committed by women in this state).<sup>55</sup> In 2003, then governor Ted Kulongoski stated, "if what I am told is true ... methamphetamine is the driver for between 85 to 90 percent of the property and identity theft crimes in this state."<sup>56</sup> Speaking of Oregon's high property crime numbers, Eric Mellgren, a Southern Oregon University criminology professor and former police chief said that, "ID theft goes hand-in-hand with meth addiction, and it's popular with women because it's a relatively safe crime."<sup>57</sup> Chemical dependency is tied to women's abuse and trauma and explains a significant proportion of their offending behaviors.

## LOW EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT

Oregon's women in prison have significant educational and employment needs upon entering prison. In 2016, of 1288 women at CCCF, 83 lacked a GED, 130 required "Adult Basic Education", 13 needed an English language program, 596 needed a "skill upgrade", and another 22 were not assessed.<sup>58</sup> In Oregon in 2012, on entry into prison, more than twice as many women had been unemployed rather than employed.<sup>59</sup> Of the 302 women who were employed prior to incarceration, only 170 of those were working full-time.<sup>60</sup>

## MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

Mental illness compounds the effects of, and often overlaps with, historical trauma and abuse among imprisoned women. In 2012, the newspaper "Willamette Week", citing DOC statistics, highlighted the fact that for incarcerated women in Oregon, "the vast majority are diagnosed ... as having mental health issues."<sup>61</sup> In 2011, 52 women at CCCF attempted suicide – a rate ten times higher than that of Oregon's male prisoner population.<sup>62</sup> In 2010, Oregon jails spent about \$3.3 million on medications to treat mental health issues and about \$3.5 million in prisons.<sup>63</sup> Available data on the prevalence of mental health issues in incarcerated women in Oregon show rates have remained relatively stable over the past several years. A report by the Oregon Commission for Women found that in 2014, 41% of incarcerated women had a "severe" mental health problem."<sup>64</sup> By contrast, only 16% had "no reported mental health need."<sup>65</sup> Today the figure is comparable; as of July 1, 2016, 39% (501 women) within CCCF's population had a "severe mental health issue."<sup>66</sup>

## MOTHERS

Oregon's incarcerated female population is composed primarily of mothers. The newspaper "Willamette Week" identified in 2012 that mothers account for 75% of Oregon's women prisoners.<sup>67</sup> From national data, we can surmise that a majority of these mothers are likely the primary caregivers of their children, most often for children who are still minors at the time of their mothers' incarceration.

A mother's incarceration impacts her children's chances of intersecting with the criminal justice system. A report entitled "Children of Incarcerated Parents Project" and submitted to the Oregon Legislature in 2002 highlights this dynamic on its first page: "[o]ne of the strongest risk factors for juvenile delinquency is a parental history of criminality."<sup>68</sup>

An Oregon Law Review article entitled, "Bending the Bars for Mothers: How Prison Alternatives Can Build a Stronger Oregon," describes some of the current policies around incarcerated mothers with respect to their ability to retain parental rights over their children. The report states that "the State's likely attempt to permanently terminate parental rights based on the length of incarceration" may prevent a mother from maintaining legal guardianship status regardless of her "nonviolent history or desire to parent."<sup>69</sup> This refers

to the State of Oregon's ability to leverage a woman's sentence against her contention that she should be allowed to parent. In Oregon, "length of imprisonment may still be offered as evidence against a parent" trying to retain custody of their child.<sup>70</sup> Increased sentence lengths for nonviolent women in the state "may therefore affect the likelihood of termination judgments."<sup>71</sup>

## JUVENILES

As of July 2015, the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) held in custody 63 girls, making up around 10% of all the young people in custody in the state.<sup>72</sup> Both adolescent and older female youth "are a growing proportion of the juvenile offender population in Oregon."<sup>73</sup> While the overall rate of incarceration of young people in Oregon is falling, the decline is more pronounced for boys than for girls.<sup>74</sup>

The OYA cites a literature review that found "delinquent activities by females often mask serious ... trauma."<sup>75</sup> Similar to adult women, girls in the criminal justice system experience significantly higher rates of abuse and exposure to trauma than their male counterparts.<sup>76</sup> A 2016 audit report by the Oregon Secretary of State entitled "Oregon Youth Authority: Female Youth Offenders Need More Transition Options" highlights that female juvenile offenders in the state have "received little, if any, treatment" for reported histories of victimization and abuse.<sup>77</sup>

The audit report also highlights a deficiency in adequate facilities for girls. Due to inadequate funding, the state is "unable to ... run the full program" for the girls' transition facility, which is intended to provide meaningful support for girls' reentry into society.<sup>78</sup>

# COFFEE CREEK CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

## OVERVIEW

Coffee Creek Correctional Facility (CCCF) is currently Oregon's only prison for women. The site is in Wilsonville, Ore., in Washington County in northwest Oregon, about 20 miles south of Portland.

CCCF is made up of two units: one minimum-security and one medium-security.<sup>79</sup> The minimum security unit opened in 2001 and the medium-security unit followed a year later. At the time of opening, CCCF was the first new women's prison built for 36 years.<sup>80</sup>

The decision to house women in a new prison came as the State of Oregon was forced to accommodate a growing female prison population. The population was growing in part as a result of policies introduced over the last two decades such as Measure 11 as well as property-crime-related laws that ordered mandatory minimum sentences for certain offenses.<sup>81 82 83</sup>

Today, CCCF's built capacity is 1253 beds to house women prisoners.<sup>84</sup> The threshold capacity is 1280. CCCF also operates the Coffee Creek Intake Center (CCIC) that temporarily houses men and women. As of 2013, this

facility included more than 400 beds for men and roughly 50 for women.<sup>86</sup>

CCCF's minimum- and medium-security units offer a number of programs for women. A full list of programs can be found through

the Oregon.gov website by going to the Coffee Creek Correctional Facility web page. The programs offered fall into the following categories:

- lifeskills programs
- library services
- education services
- behavioral and mental health services
- treatment programs
- transition programs
- parenting and family programs
- religious services and activities cognitive-based programs
- work programs
- Oregon Corrections Enterprises
- several other programs that don't fit into any of these categories.<sup>87</sup>



# CONDITIONS AT CCCF: ALLEGATIONS OF ABUSE AND MISCONDUCT

A lawsuit from 2004 accusing two employees – “one a command-level officer” – of having sex with an inmate led to Oregon making sexual intercourse with an inmate a felony offense for a corrections employee or contractor.<sup>89</sup> Despite this, sexual abuse incidents have persisted.

Since CCCF opened, it has been the site of a number of allegations of sexual abuse and misconduct by staff toward inmates. Allegations of abuse and misconduct date back to 2002, just a year after the facility opened, as “The Oregonian” reported in a 2012 article called “Abuse of Women Inmates at Oregon’s Coffee Creek Prison Goes on for Years.”<sup>88</sup>

An audit of CCCF was conducted in 2015 led by a team of three certified US Department of Justice PREA (Prison Rape Elimination Act) monitors. A report was compiled on the staff, general prison conditions, and implementation of PREA standards at CCCF. The audit used “special and randomized” interviews of prisoners and staff alike and found overall that the professionalism of staff, cleanliness of facilities, and implementation of PREA standards were all satisfactory.<sup>95</sup>

There have been other troubling allegations emerging from CCCF in recent years.<sup>96</sup> In 2015, women who were part of a program that allowed them to pump and store breastmilk for transfer to their babies’ caregivers discovered bags of milk had been mixed up and given to the wrong recipients.<sup>97</sup> The error was detected by one of the women’s families and the Oregonian reported that the mix-up was attended to “only after inmates figured out what was happening on their own.”<sup>98</sup>

“The Oregonian” reported on a series of abuses that occurred over a number of years and with multiple staff implicated, resulting eventually in “unprecedented state settlements with 17 victims.”<sup>90</sup> That same report illustrates constraints on CCCF’s ability to self-monitor that may have allowed misconduct to proliferate at the prison. For example, Paul Golden, who was hired shortly after the two employees accused in the 2004 lawsuit were fired, was investigated but eventually cleared after allegations he was “behaving improperly” with one of the inmates.<sup>91</sup> Golden’s two supervisors, who said that they “never suspected he was abusing inmates” were themselves investigated on sexual misconduct accusations.<sup>92</sup> Golden’s eventual arrest came only after allegations of misconduct began to accumulate. Speaking to the lack of responsiveness to women’s needs, The Oregonian reports that upon prison staff hearing about possible misconduct, women have sometimes been put in segregated housing typically reserved “for seriously misbehaving inmates” which may deter other women from being forthcoming about staff misconduct.<sup>93</sup> The paper also observed that “security weaknesses [such as surveillance of certain parts of the facility] ... remain because prison managers couldn’t get money to fix them.”<sup>94</sup>

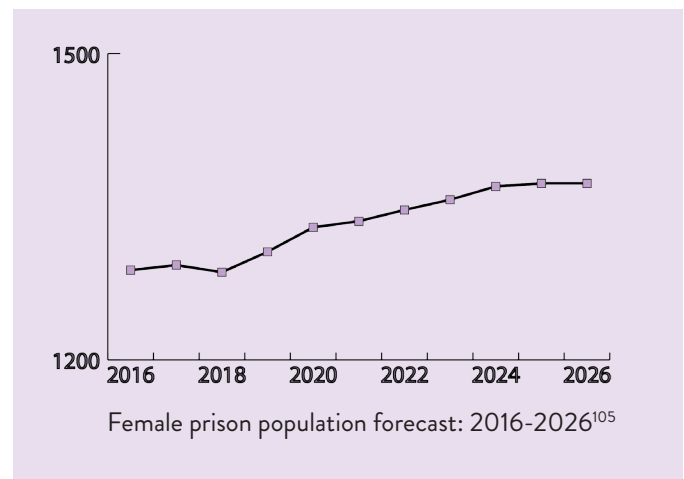
# WOMEN PRISONER POPULATION FORECAST AND THE POSSIBLE OPENING OF THE OREGON STATE PENITENTIARY – MINIMUM UNIT

The growing female prison population in Oregon has led to a request by the Department of Corrections in 2016 for funding to open a section for women at the Oregon State Penitentiary (OSP) minimum-security facility in Salem.

From July 2015 to May 2016, the CCCF women's population was hovering near the threshold and was "over the threshold about 30% of the time."<sup>99</sup>

Coffee Creek Correctional Facility has been at or over capacity for the past several months since June 2016. A September 1, 2016, Oregon DOC report shows that the female prison population was above CCCF's maximum population threshold of 1280 by 25 women at a total of 1305.<sup>100</sup>

The most recent population forecast from April 1, 2016, predicts a modest overall increase in the female prison population in Oregon over roughly the next year, and an increase of 83 women over the next ten years.<sup>101</sup>



An analysis by the Oregon Legislative Fiscal Office dated May 2016 that uses prison population forecasts from the Office of Economic Analysis, makes a request for \$10.5 million to fund the opening of 176 beds at OSP Minimum to house women prisoners in response to the growing population.<sup>102</sup>

The money would "repair and equip the facility, fund 81 staff positions, and house women offenders at OSPM."<sup>103</sup> The report further estimates that the "[o]perating costs for the biennium are ... \$16,103,724" and that the "agency is currently projecting an operating deficit in 2015-2017 of \$11 million, which increases to \$20.5 million when the unfunded portion of the request [i.e. the \$10.5 million requested for opening OSPM] is included."<sup>104</sup>

# INTRODUCTION

Over the last four decades, the number of incarcerated Americans has ballooned by more than 500%. While American women as a whole make up only 5% of the world's female population, incarcerated American women are 30% of the world's incarcerated female population.<sup>1</sup>

This trend toward growing prison and jail populations has been mirrored in Oregon. Its causes are numerous, including so-called “tough on crime” policies, mandatory minimum sentencing, and the ramping up of charging practices by district attorneys. Contrary to many people's assumptions, increasing crime rates are not the cause of increased incarceration.

Despite today's relatively low crime rates, the number of women imprisoned in Oregon has nearly tripled from 324 in 1994 to 1249 in 2015.<sup>2</sup> The overwhelming majority of women now

incarcerated in Oregon would not have been put behind bars a generation ago for the same crimes.<sup>3</sup> Most women in prison in Oregon were sentenced for nonviolent property or drug crimes. Women present a low public safety risk: they are less likely than men to be incarcerated for violent offenses. An estimated

75% of Oregon's women prisoners are mothers.<sup>4</sup> Children growing up with a parent behind bars face intergenerational cycles of significant diminished future earning potential and increased likelihood of foster care placement and even future incarceration.<sup>5</sup>

Today, Oregon's only women's prison – Coffee Creek Correctional Facility in

Wilsonville – is at capacity with a population hovering around 1300 women. This is the highest level in Oregon's history.

Oregon faces the possibility of opening a new facility for women prisoners at Oregon State Penitentiary's Minimum Unit in order to accommodate the growth in the female prison population. This presents a unique opportunity to reevaluate how many women we are locking up and why before we commit to an expensive alternative of uncertain duration.

# PROPOSED PRISON BEDS EXPANSION

Oregon's women's prison, Coffee Creek Correctional Facility (CCCF) has a current population of 1305 – 25 above its official capacity. The proposed solution to this problem is to open a facility within the Oregon State Penitentiary Minimum Unit in Salem to house more women.

In 2016, Oregon legislators are set to approve or deny a budget proposal to direct an additional \$10.5 million towards the Department of Corrections Budget to fund this prison bed expansion.<sup>6</sup> The discussion is likely to center on whether the extra prison beds are needed in light of prison population forecasts, not on more fundamental questions about how many women we are locking up and why. It is doubtful those communities most impacted by this decision, such as communities of color and those living in poverty will be at the center of discussions. State priorities may not be questioned

around whether we should continue to spend taxpayer money on incarcerating more and more women. With a decision to earmark additional funds toward more prison beds will come the indirect decision not to spend that money on other urgent competing priorities such as affordable housing, infrastructure

or education.

The relentless growth in Oregon's women's prison population over the last 40 years shows why Oregonians can no longer hope to incarcerate their way out of problems such as trauma, addiction, mental illness, homelessness and poverty.

Oregonians and their legislators do not have to agree to continue

the failed past practice of using incarceration to try to fix society's problems. Of course, there are women who commit crimes where incarceration is the appropriate punishment but in other cases there are appropriate alternatives available. Oregon could choose solutions that will both reduce its prison population and save a substantial amount of taxpayer dollars as well as avoid the harms done by incarceration to women and their families.

Instead of appropriating the requested funding to increase prison beds, elected officials and other stakeholders should mirror the national reform movement by embracing alternatives. The proposal to open the women's unit at OSP-M provides an important opportunity to change course.

# IMMEDIATE SOLUTIONS

Oregon legislators should deny the Department of Corrections' request to fund a new women's prison unit at OSP-M. But in doing so they should recognize that it is bad policy and unfair practice to require prison staff, contractors, and inmates to endure the potentially dangerous and uncomfortable situations that can be created by overcrowding. The best way forward is not to

try to find the money to open OSP-M by cutting staff or their benefits, or by eliminating programming options for inmates or other cost-cutting solutions that might be suggested as alternatives.

There are solutions that can be put in place in a minimal amount of time which may prevent the need to expand prison beds in Oregon.

These options may require action on the part of the governor, the legislature and/or district attorneys. Elected officials can also take time to consider solutions that will take a longer time to put in place but will more effectively address the roots of crime. In the short term, the opening of OSP-M can be avoided by these six proposed solutions.

## 1. EXPANDING ELIGIBILITY AND USE OF THE FAMILY SENTENCING ALTERNATIVE PILOT PROGRAM

In 2015, Oregon legislators passed HB 3503 to create the Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program (FSAPP). The law was modeled after a similar program in Washington state (SSB 6639).

FSAPP is currently being piloted by five Oregon counties in

partnership with the Department of Corrections, county courts, community corrections agencies and the Department of Human Services. People may be eligible if their presumptive sentence is for one year or more, if they have never been convicted of certain crimes, if they are not being

sentenced for certain offenses, and if they are the parent or legal guardian of a minor child and had physical custody at the time of the offense. The court will then decide at the time of sentencing whether to divert an individual to FSAPP. People who are admitted to FSAPP are sentenced to probation



in the community. This is intended to maintain family bonds and help to reduce or avoid

the harmful effects of parental incarceration on children. According to the Oregon

Department of Corrections, 31 women were participating in FSAPP as of July 19, 2016.

## PROPOSED FIX #1

Legislators should make a statutory language fix as proposed by the Department of Corrections' white paper: FSAPP (HB 3503) to expand the eligibility of women to participate in the program:

- Remove statutory language restricting prior person felonies (830(2)(A))
- Remove statutory language restricting 813.010 (Felony DUII) (830(2)(C))
- Add statutory language allowing for consideration of otherwise eligible pregnant offenders

## 2. STREAMLINING THE CLEMENCY PROCESS

Incarcerated people in Oregon may appeal to the governor for clemency that will reduce or relieve their sentence or fine or even forgive them for the crime they have committed. The

governor has the power, granted to her by the people through the state constitution, to grant pardons, commutations, reprieves and remissions of fines. Petitioners for executive clemency

must demonstrate significant rehabilitation. Clemency is rarely granted in Oregon but could be used more often to recognize the extraordinary efforts of some inmates toward rehabilitation.

## PROPOSED FIX #2

Advocates and attorneys should present the governor with streamlined criteria for clemency petition approval that specifically address the characteristics of women offenders. The criteria should focus on categories of women and cases who may be appropriate recipients of clemency such as seniors, nonviolent property and/or drug offenders, or women who have experienced significant levels of intimate partner violence which contributed to the commission of their crime. Advocates and attorneys should prepare and submit clemency petitions on behalf of incarcerated women.

The governor should give consideration to the proposed streamlined criteria for clemency. She should also weigh following the example set by President Obama in his decision to use his executive powers to commute the sentences of more than 500 people, reflecting his belief that, "America is a nation of second chances." The Governor has the opportunity to offer a second chance to those Oregonians she judges worthy of it, greatly benefiting them and their families.

### 3. EARLY RELEASE FOR TERMINALLY/SEVERELY ILL, PERMANENTLY INCAPACITATED OR ELDERLY PRISONERS

The State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision is empowered to advance the release date of a prisoner in Oregon who is severely or terminally ill, is permanently incapacitated, or is

elderly. The prisoner's release date can be brought forward if the Board decides that continuing to incarcerate would be cruel or inhumane and not in the best interests of the prisoner and

society. This does not apply to people who are sentenced to life imprisonment without the possibility of parole.

#### PROPOSED FIX #3

Working with the Department of Corrections, attorneys and advocates should identify and review the cases of all women who may be eligible for early release due to their severe or terminal illness, permanent incapacitation or advanced age. The State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision should review applications and grant them where it is clear that an inmate meets the requirements to qualify for an advanced release date and that it would be in her and the community's best interests if she were to leave prison early.

### 4. SENSITIVE HANDLING OF PROBATION AND POST-PRISON SUPERVISION TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS

Defendants in Oregon may be sentenced to probation rather than prison or jail, allowing them to remain in their communities but requiring them to comply with certain rules or conditions. Oregonians may also be required

to spend time in post-prison supervision for a period following their release, complying with certain rules or conditions in a similar way to people on probation. A probation or post-prison supervision violation

occurs when a person fails to comply with the rules that have been set for them. Violations can result in someone being sent (or sent back) to prison, thereby increasing the numbers of incarcerated people.

#### PROPOSED FIX #4

District attorneys and probation officers should continue to work persistently to assist women who have committed technical violations of their probation or post-prison supervision but have not committed new crimes. Alternatives to (re)incarceration should be considered first to address violations.

## 5. EXPAND ACCESS TO TRANSITIONAL LEAVE AND ALTERNATIVE INCARCERATION PROGRAMS

Some incarcerated Oregonians may qualify for transitional leave; that is, a period at the end of their sentence that is served in the community with the goal of achieving successful reentry. Transitional leave may begin no more than 90 days before the

end of an inmate's sentence and requires individuals to develop a plan for how their transition time can best be used to reintegrate into their community. Alternative incarceration programs allow individuals to be sentenced to drug treatment or cognitive

behavioral therapy programs rather than incarceration. Upon completion of AIP they may be eligible for early release. Each of these programs therefore helps to reduce the number of people incarcerated in Oregon.

### PROPOSED FIX #5

The legislature should expand short term transitional leave from the current maximum duration of 90 days. Lawmakers and DOC should also expand eligibility for and the capacity of alternative incarceration programs.

## 6. INCREASED PRO BONO ASSISTANCE TO WOMEN WHO MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR PAROLE

People who are eligible for parole may be released from incarceration before their maximum sentence is complete provided they agree to comply with certain conditions and have demonstrated that it is appropriate for them to be allowed to return

to the community at that time. At a parole hearing, members of the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision consider whether an woman should be granted parole and allowed to leave incarceration and finish

serving her sentence under community supervision. The Board does not have authority over people serving certain types of sentences such as mandatory minimums who cannot have their sentences reduced.

### PROPOSED FIX #6

Working with the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision and the Department of Corrections, advocates and attorneys should review the cases of all women who are or will be eligible for parole. Pro bono assistance should be provided to these women to allow them to fully represent the merits of their cases at parole hearings.

# STAKEHOLDERS

## GOVERNOR

The Governor is vested with the authority bestowed by the Oregon constitution to grant executive clemency to petitioners seeking pardons, commutations, reprieves or remission of fines. She can follow President Obama's lead in granting clemency to incarcerated individuals who have demonstrated rehabilitation and shown that they would pose little threat to society if they are released.

## LEGISLATURE

Legislators have the power to pass statutory fixes identified by the Department of Corrections to expand eligibility for the Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program to increase the number of mothers eligible to participate. The legislature should also look at expanding transitional leave and expanding eligibility for and the capacity of alternative incarceration programs.

## DISTRICT ATTORNEYS

District attorneys and their staff should be mindful of the option of diverting women away from prison and into alternatives to incarceration such as the Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program. If each of the pilot counties (Deschutes, Jackson, Lane, Marion and Multnomah) expanded enrollment of women in the FSAPP by just ten women, the opening of OSP Minimum could be avoided. District attorneys should work with community corrections agencies to continue to assist women who have committed technical violations of their probation but have not committed new crimes. Alternatives to incarceration should be considered first to address violations.



## ADVOCATES AND ATTORNEYS

Advocates and attorneys should provide legal and other assistance where they can in several areas to women. They should research and develop criteria for clemency petitions that specifically apply to women and present those to the governor for her to consider. They should assist individual women in preparing and submitting their petitions for executive clemency. Advocates and attorneys should work with the Department of Corrections to identify and review cases of women who may be eligible for early release due to their severe/terminal illness, permanent incapacitation or advanced age. They should review the cases of women who are or will be eligible for parole and provide pro bono assistance with hearings.

## DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

The Department of Corrections should work with advocates and attorneys to identify and review cases of women who may be eligible for early release due to their severe/terminal illness, permanent incapacitation or advanced age. If the legislature agrees to increase transitional leave, DOC should work with women to develop transition plans and prepare for their release into community supervision. DOC should also work with the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision as well as advocates and attorneys to review the cases of women who are or will be eligible for parole.

## STATE BOARD OF PAROLE AND POST-PRISON SUPERVISION

The State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision should review cases of women who may be eligible for early release due to their severe/terminal illness, permanent incapacitation or advanced age. They should work with the Department of Corrections to review the cases of women who are or will be eligible for parole.

## COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS AGENCIES

Community corrections agencies should work with district attorneys to continue to assist women who have committed technical violations of their probation but have not committed new crimes. Alternatives to incarceration should be considered first to address violations.

# CONCLUSION

Decisions made by elected officials in the coming months will have real world consequences for struggling Oregonians. The continuing growth in Oregon's incarcerated population robs state coffers of the funds to spend on other urgent priorities such as education and mental health treatment.

New thinking is needed. Elected officials have the power to veto prison expansion and invest in policies, practices and reforms that cost less and benefit more. We can address root causes of crime at a fraction of the human and fiscal cost of incarceration.

## LONG TERM SOLUTIONS

While we have focused on achievable, immediate solutions to overcrowding at CCCF, it is clear that longer term action is needed to stem the flow of new women into our correctional system. A deeper discussion needs to take place about the purpose and effectiveness of incarceration as a response to a wide range of

crimes, many of them nonviolent and nonsexual in nature. We should question how long we are locking women up for, at what cost and why we are doing so.

Two groups in particular have the authority and the opportunity to create change:

## DISTRICT ATTORNEYS

District attorneys are some of the most powerful actors in the system. Incarceration trends could change rapidly if DAs changed their charging practices. Instead of using convictions as a measure of success, prosecutors could be encouraged to aim to reduce the prison population, saving money to invest in alternatives with proven successful outcomes.

## LEGISLATORS

Legislators could take the lead in overhauling so-called "tough on crime" policies and criminal codes. They should request an analysis of the impact Measure 57 has had on the incarceration rate

of women and consider suspending or repealing it. Mandatory minimum sentencing laws such as Measure 57 take away the power of judges to weigh all aspects of a case and impose an appropriate sentence. They represent a transfer of sentencing power from judges who act in public to prosecutors who have total discretion over which charges to bring against a defendant and whether to engage in plea bargaining. Their charging decisions are made in private. A smarter approach to sentencing reform would allow judges more flexibility and the opportunity to determine appropriate punishments for each defendant. With proportionate sentences we could reduce sentence length without endangering public safety.

Legislators could also learn from examples in other states. In California, the habeas law allows women to have their sentences reexamined if their crimes arose from a domestic violence situation.<sup>7</sup> Women may be eligible for early release or "time served."

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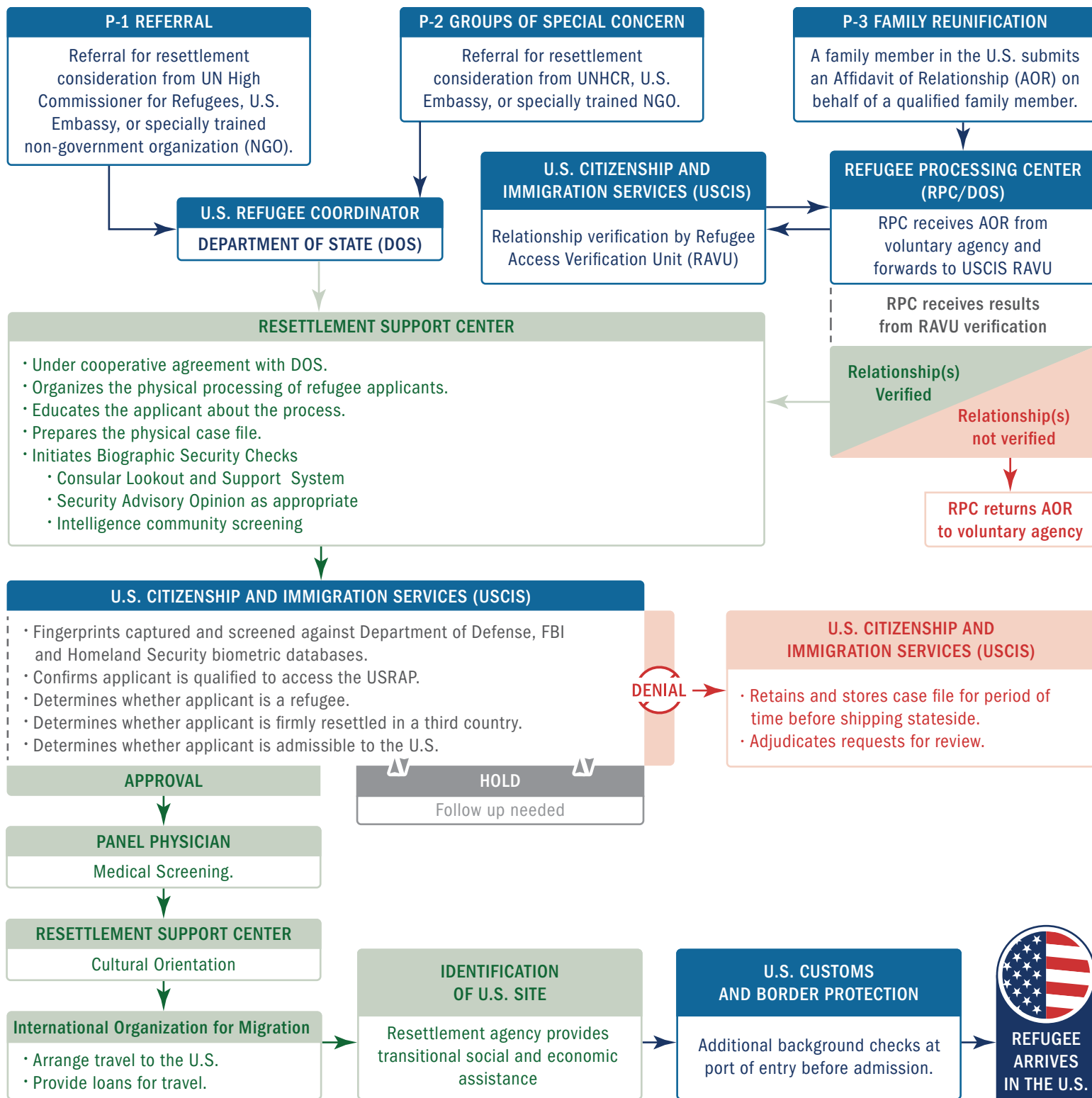
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# UNITED STATES REFUGEE ADMISSIONS PROGRAM (USRAP)

## Refugee Security Screening

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) is deeply committed to safeguarding the American public from threats to public safety and national security, just as we are committed to providing refuge to some of the world's most vulnerable people. We do not believe these goals are mutually exclusive, or that either has to be pursued at the expense of the other.

This fact sheet provides information about the security screening and background checks required by the [U.S. Refugee Admissions Program \(USRAP\)](#). The USRAP is an interagency effort involving a number of governmental and non-governmental partners both overseas and in the United States. Applicants for refugee resettlement are subject to the highest degree of security screening and background checks for any category of traveler to the United States.

All refugee applicants receive a standard suite of biographic and biometric security checks. Through close coordination with the federal law enforcement and intelligence communities, these checks are continually reviewed to identify potential enhancements and to develop approaches for specific populations that may pose particular threats. All case members included on a refugee application must clear security checks for that application to be approved.

**Processing priorities** are established annually that determine which of the world's refugees are "of special humanitarian concern to the United States," i.e., eligible to be considered for possible resettlement in the United States. Fitting into a processing priority gives a refugee applicant the opportunity for an interview with a USCIS officer but does not guarantee approval. The priorities currently in use are:

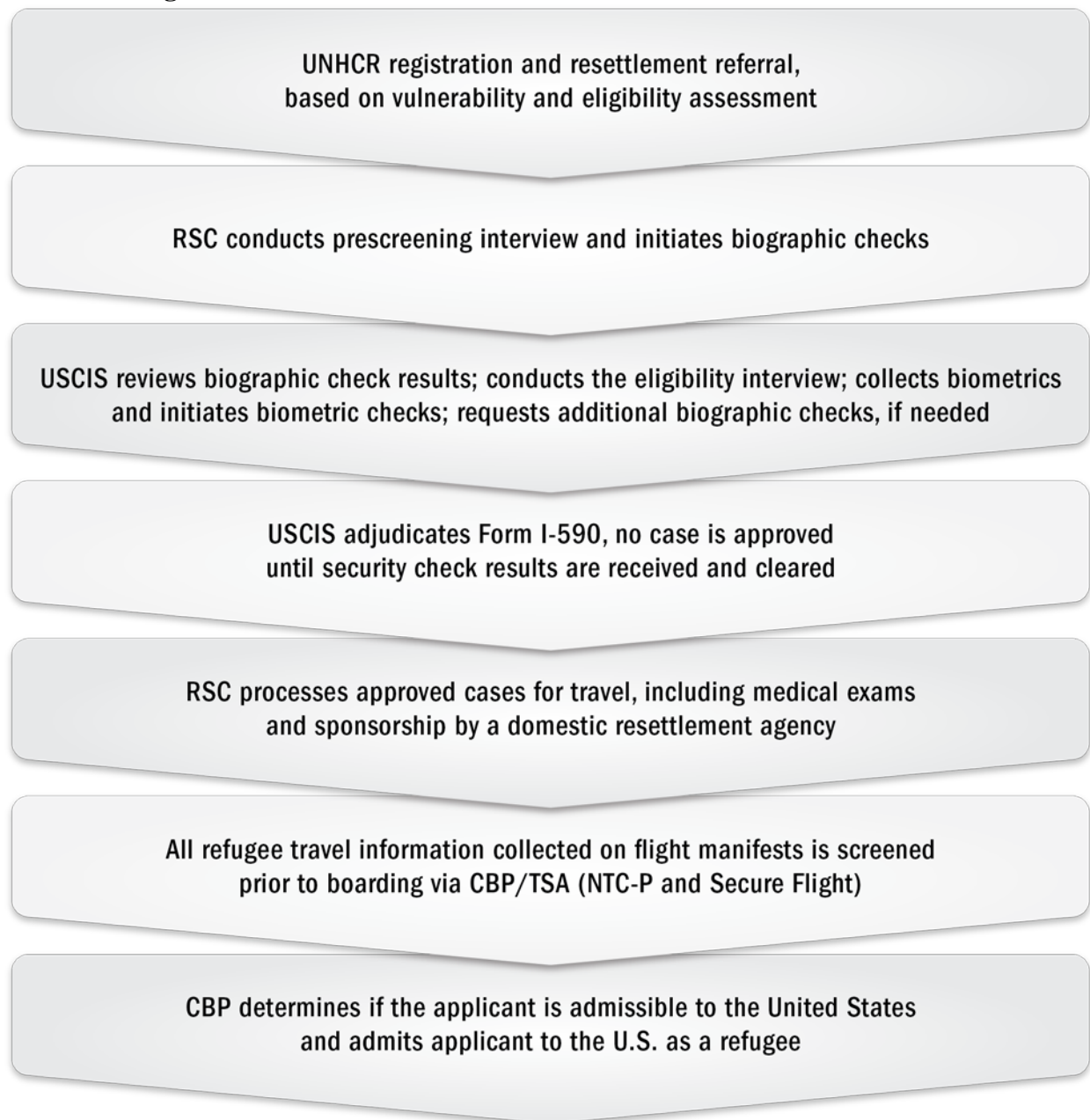
- **Priority 1:** UN High Commissioner for Refugees, U.S. Embassy, or specially-trained non-governmental organization (NGO) identified cases, including persons facing compelling security concerns, women-at-risk, victims of torture or violence and others in need of resettlement
- **Priority 2:** Groups of special concern identified by the U.S. refugee program (e.g., Bhutanese in Nepal)
- **Priority 3:** Family reunification cases (i.e., spouses, unmarried children under 21, and parents of persons lawfully admitted to the U.S. as refugees or asylees or persons who are legal permanent residents or U.S. citizens who previously had refugee or asylum status)

USCIS' adjudication of Form I-590, Registration for Classification as a Refugee, is only one part of the broader USRAP:



- The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) identifies and refers certain cases to the USRAP for resettlement and provides important information about the worldwide refugee situation. Department of State (State) has overall coordination and management responsibility for the USRAP and has the lead in proposing admissions ceilings and processing priorities.
- Resettlement Support Centers (RSCs), under cooperative agreements with State, carry out administrative and processing functions, such as file preparation and storage, data collection, and out-processing activities.
- USCIS is responsible for conducting individual interviews with applicants to determine their eligibility for refugee status, including whether they meet the refugee definition and are otherwise admissible to the United States under U.S. law.

## **USRAP Screening**

USRAP screening includes both biometric and biographic checks, which occur at multiple stages throughout the process, including immediately before a refugee's departure to the United States as well as upon arrival in the United States.

The screening of refugee applicants involves numerous biographic checks that are initiated by the RSCs and reviewed/resolved by USCIS. These include:

- **Department of State Consular Lookout and Support System (CLASS)<sup>1</sup>**  
CLASS name checks are initiated by State for all refugee applicants at the time of pre-screening by State's contractor — the RSC. Name checks are conducted on the applicant's primary names as well as any variations used by the applicant. Responses are received prior to interview and possible matches to applicants are reviewed and adjudicated by USCIS Headquarters. Evidence of the response is forwarded for inclusion in the case file. If there is a new name or variation developed or identified at the interview, USCIS requests another CLASS name check on the new name, and the case is placed on hold until that response is received.
- **Security Advisory Opinion (SAO)<sup>2</sup>**  
The SAO is a State-initiated biographic check conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and intelligence community partners. SAO name checks are initiated at the time of pre-screening by the RSC for the groups and nationalities designated by the U.S. government as requiring this higher level check. SAOs are processed, and a response must be received prior to finalizing the decision. If there is a new name or variation developed at the interview, USCIS requests that another SAO be conducted on the new name, and the case is placed on hold until that response is received.
- **Interagency Check (IAC)**  
The IAC screens biographic data, including names, dates of birth and other data points of all refugee applicants within designated age ranges. This information is captured at the time of pre-screening and is provided to intelligence community partners. This screening procedure was initiated in 2008 and has expanded over time to include a broader range of applicants and records. These checks occur throughout the process.

At the time of USCIS interview, USCIS staff collects fingerprints and initiates biometric checks. The biometric checks initiated by USCIS for refugee applicants include:

- **FBI Fingerprint Check through Next Generation Identification (NGI)**

<sup>1</sup> CLASS is a State name-check database that posts use to access critical information for adjudicating immigration applications.. The system contains records provided by numerous agencies and includes information on persons with visa refusals, immigration violations, criminal histories, and terrorism concerns, as well as intelligence information and child support enforcement data. In addition to containing information from State sources, sources for information in CLASS includes NCTC/TSC (terrorist watch lists), TECS, Interpol, DEA, HHS and FBI (extracts of the NCIC Wanted Person, Immigration Violator, Foreign Fugitive Files, VGTOF, and the Interstate Identification Index).

<sup>2</sup> The Security Advisory Opinion process was implemented after September 11, 2001, to provide a mechanism for additional scrutiny to certain higher-risk categories of individuals seeking to enter the United States through a variety of means, including refugee applicants.

Recurring biometric record checks pertaining to criminal history and previous immigration data.

- **DHS Automated Biometric Identification System (IDENT - f/n/a US-VISIT)**  
A biometric record check related to travel and immigration history for non-U.S. citizens as well as immigration violations, and law enforcement and national security concerns. Enrollment in IDENT also allows CBP to confirm identity at the port of entry.
- **DOD Defense Forensics and Biometrics Agency (DFBA)'s Automated Biometric Identification System (ABIS)i**  
A biometric record check of DOD holdings collected in areas of conflict (predominantly Iraq and Afghanistan). DOD screening began in 2007 for Iraqi applicants and was incrementally expanded to all nationalities by 2013. CBP's National Targeting Center-Passenger (NTC-P) conducts biographic vetting of all ABIS biometric matches (both derogatory and benign) against various classified and unclassified U.S. government databases.

### **USCIS Interview**

The USCIS refugee interview itself, though not a traditional system check, is also a vital part of the refugee screening process. Highly trained USCIS officers conduct extensive interviews with each refugee applicant to elicit information about the applicant's claim for refugee status and admissibility. During the interview, the officer:

- Confirms the basic biographical data of the applicant;
- Verifies that the applicant was properly given access to the USRAP;
- Determines whether the applicant has suffered past persecution or has a well-founded fear of future persecution on the basis of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion in his or her home country; and
- Determines whether the applicant is admissible to the United States and whether he or she has been firmly resettled in another country.

The officer develops lines of questioning to elicit information regarding any involvement in terrorist activity, criminal activity or the persecution/torture of others, and conducts a credibility assessment on each applicant. USCIS officers receive training on country-specific issues for populations they interview, including briefings from outside experts from the intelligence, policy and academic communities.

### **Controlled Application Review and Resolution Process (CARRP)**

During the routine process of adjudicating any USCIS benefit, if any national security concerns are raised, either based on security and background checks or personal interviews or testimony, USCIS conducts an additional review through the internal CARRP process.

### **Syria Enhanced Review**

USCIS' Refugee, Asylum and International Operations Directorate and Fraud Detection and National Security Directorate (FDNS) have collaborated to provide for enhanced review of certain Syrian cases. This review involves FDNS providing intelligence-driven support to refugee adjudicators, including threat identification, and suggesting topics for questioning. FDNS also monitors terrorist watch lists and disseminates intelligence information reports on any applicants who are determined to present a national security threat.

### **CBP Screening**

An applicant with a USCIS-approved Form I-590, Registration for Classification as a Refugee, must be found admissible to the United States by Customs and Border Protection (CBP) before receiving refugee status. CBP receives a manifest of all individuals who have approved Forms I-590 and have been booked for travel to the United States by air. CBP receives this manifest eight days before the scheduled travel. CBP performs initial vetting of the individuals before they arrive at a U.S. airport and conducts additional background checks of these individuals upon arrival at a U.S. airport.

# Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Tip Sheet

## At a Glance: Renewal DACA Process

### Renewal DACA



#### Guidelines

You may request to renew DACA if you met the guidelines for initial DACA and you:

- Did not depart the United States on or after Aug. 15, 2012, without advance parole;
- Have continuously resided in the United States since you submitted your most recent request for DACA up to the present time; and
- Have not been convicted of a felony, a significant misdemeanor, or three or more misdemeanors, and do not otherwise pose a threat to national security or public safety.



#### How to Request

- Complete and sign:
  - ❑ Form I-821D, Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals;
  - ❑ Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization; and
  - ❑ Form I-765W, Worksheet.
- ❑ Submit all three forms, the \$495 filing and biometrics fee and any required documentation to the proper USCIS filing location following the instructions on the forms.
- ❑ Do not provide any additional documents at the time you request renewal of DACA unless you have new documents pertaining to removal proceedings or criminal history that you have not already submitted to USCIS in a previously approved DACA request.



#### When to File

USCIS will consider, on an individual, case by case basis properly filed pending DACA renewal requests and associated applications for Employment Authorization from:

- DACA recipients that have been received as of Sept. 5, 2017, and
- DACA recipients whose DACA will expire on or between Sept. 5, 2017 and March 5, 2018 that have been received as of Oct. 5, 2017.

Dear Acting Secretary Duke,

I write to advise that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) should rescind the June 15, 2012, DHS Memorandum entitled “Exercising Prosecutorial Discretion with Respect to Individuals Who Came to the United States as Children,” as well as any related memoranda or guidance. This policy, known as “Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals” (DACA), allows certain individuals who are without lawful status in the United States to request and receive a renewable, two-year presumptive reprieve from removal, and other benefits such as work authorization and participation in the Social Security program.

DACA was effectuated by the previous administration through executive action, without proper statutory authority and with no established end-date, after Congress’ repeated rejection of proposed legislation that would have accomplished a similar result. Such an open-ended circumvention of immigration laws was an unconstitutional exercise of authority by the Executive Branch. The related Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents (DAPA) policy was enjoined on a nationwide basis in a decision affirmed by the Fifth Circuit on the basis of multiple legal grounds and then by the Supreme Court by an equally divided vote. *See Texas v. United States*, 86 F. Supp. 3d 591, 669-70 (S.D. Tex.), *aff’d*, 809 F.3d 134, 171-86 (5th Cir. 2015), *aff’d by equally divided Court*, 136 S. Ct. 2271 (2016). Then-Secretary of Homeland Security John Kelly rescinded the DAPA policy in June. Because the DACA policy has the same legal and constitutional defects that the courts recognized as to DAPA, it is likely that potentially imminent litigation would yield similar results with respect to DACA.

In light of the costs and burdens that will be imposed on DHS associated with rescinding this policy, DHS should consider an orderly and efficient wind-down process.

As Attorney General of the United States, I have a duty to defend the Constitution and to faithfully execute the laws passed by Congress. Proper enforcement of our immigration laws is, as President Trump consistently said, critical to the national interest and to the restoration of the rule of law in our country. The Department of Justice stands ready to assist and to continue to support DHS in these important efforts.

SUBJECT: Enforcement Actions at or Focused on Sensitive Locations

Purpose

This memorandum sets forth Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) policy regarding certain enforcement actions by ICE officers and agents at or focused on sensitive locations. This policy is designed to ensure that these enforcement actions do not occur at nor are focused on sensitive locations such as schools and churches unless (a) exigent circumstances exist, (b) other law enforcement actions have led officers to a sensitive location as described in the "*Exceptions to the General Rule*" section of this policy memorandum, or (c) prior approval is obtained. This policy supersedes all prior agency policy on this subject.<sup>1</sup>

Definitions

The enforcement actions covered by this policy are (1) arrests; (2) interviews; (3) searches; and (4) for purposes of immigration enforcement only, surveillance. Actions not covered by this policy include actions such as obtaining records, documents and similar materials from officials or employees, providing notice to officials or employees, serving subpoenas, engaging in Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) compliance and certification visits, or participating in official functions or community meetings.

The sensitive locations covered by this policy include, but are not limited to, the following:

- schools (including pre-schools, primary schools, secondary schools, post-secondary schools up to and including colleges and universities, and other institutions of learning such as vocational or trade schools);
- hospitals;
- churches, synagogues, mosques or other institutions of worship, such as buildings rented for the purpose of religious services;
- the site of a funeral, wedding, or other public religious ceremony; and
- a site during the occurrence of a public demonstration, such as a march, rally or parade.

This is not an exclusive list, and ICE officers and agents shall consult with their supervisors if the location of a planned enforcement operation could reasonably be viewed as being at or near a sensitive location. Supervisors should take extra care when assessing whether a planned enforcement action could reasonably be viewed as causing significant disruption to the normal operations of the sensitive location. ICE employees should also exercise caution. For example, particular care should be exercised with any organization assisting children, pregnant women, victims of crime or abuse, or individuals with significant mental or physical disabilities.

### Agency Policy

#### *General Rule*

Any planned enforcement action at or focused on a sensitive location covered by this policy must have prior approval of one of the following officials: the Assistant Director of Operations, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI); the Executive Associate Director (EAD) of HSI; the Assistant Director for Field Operations, Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO); or the EAD of ERO. This includes planned enforcement actions at or focused on a sensitive location which is part of a joint case led by another law enforcement agency. ICE will give special consideration to requests for enforcement actions at or near sensitive locations if the only known address of a target is at or near a sensitive location (e.g., a target's only known address is next to a church or across the street from a school).

#### *Exceptions to the General Rule*

This policy is meant to ensure that ICE officers and agents exercise sound judgment when enforcing federal law at or focused on sensitive locations and make substantial efforts to avoid unnecessarily alarming local communities. The policy is not intended to categorically prohibit lawful enforcement operations when there is an immediate need for enforcement action as outlined below. ICE officers and agents may carry out an enforcement action covered by this policy without prior approval from headquarters when one of the following exigent circumstances exists:

- the enforcement action involves a national security or terrorism matter;
- there is an imminent risk of death, violence, or physical harm to any person or property;

- the enforcement action involves the immediate arrest or pursuit of a dangerous felon, terrorist suspect, or any other individual(s) that present an imminent danger to public safety; or
- there is an imminent risk of destruction of evidence material to an ongoing criminal case.

When proceeding with an enforcement action under these extraordinary circumstances, officers and agents must conduct themselves as discretely as possible, consistent with officer and public safety, and make every effort to limit the time at or focused on the sensitive location.

If, in the course of a planned or unplanned enforcement action that is not initiated at or focused on a sensitive location, ICE officers or agents are subsequently led to or near a sensitive location, barring an exigent need for an enforcement action, as provided above, such officers or agents must conduct themselves in a discrete manner, maintain surveillance if no threat to officer safety exists and immediately consult their supervisor prior to taking other enforcement action(s).

#### Dissemination

Each Field Office Director, Special Agent in Charge, and Chief Counsel shall ensure that the employees under his or her supervision receive a copy of this policy and adhere to its provisions.

#### Training

Each Field Office Director, Special Agent in Charge, and Chief Counsel shall ensure that the employees under his or her supervision are trained (both online and in-person/classroom) annually on enforcement actions at or focused on sensitive locations.

#### No Private Right of Action

Nothing in this memorandum is intended to and may not be relied upon to create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law by any party in any administrative, civil, or criminal matter.

This memorandum provides management guidance to ICE officers exercising discretionary law enforcement functions, and does not affect the statutory authority of ICE officers and agents, nor is it intended to condone violations of federal law at sensitive locations.
